Fuck the Police Protest (BFO 2 2012-0004)

25 Feb 12, 1800 hours

Situation (Fuck the Police Movement)

- On 31 Dec 11, an Occupy Oakland (OO) off-shoot, Fuck the Police (FTP), marched to the PAB, burned OPD's U.S. Flag, vandalized the building, and threw an M-80 at NCJ.
- Since 31 Dec 11, FTP has conducted weekly Sat night marches. Crowd size has ranged from 75-200 individuals. Activities during these marches have included vandalism of businesses/police cars, dragging objects into the street, burning the US Flag, and throwing objects at the police.
- The 11 and 18 Feb 12 FTP marches were generally peaceful. Activities included:
 - Approx. 75-100 protesters
 - Marched from FOP into Berkeley
 - Stopped at 19th St./Telegraph to pick up marchers with stay-away orders
 - Zachary "Running Wolf" burned 1-2 U.S Flags
 - Tagging that publicized the 1 May 12 General Strike
 - Two follow vehicles (Chev Trailblazer Gry, 80 Hond Acc 4D)

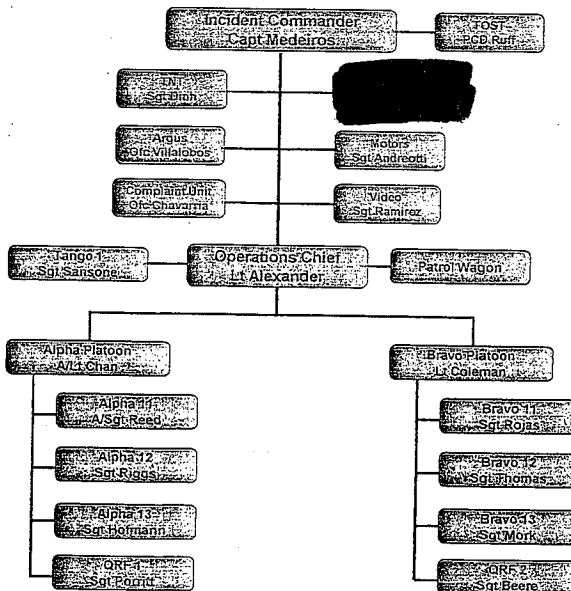
Situation (Operation-specific)

- On 25 Feb 12, FTP plans to conduct a rally at FOP at 1900 hrs, and march to a location TBD at 2100 hrs. This march has been a weekly event, since 31 Dec 11.
- There has not been a lot of advertisement for this march. There is no concrete intelligence on the crowd size, march start point, the route of march, or the marchers' specific intentions.
- Factors that may indicate increased crowd size:
 - Residual protestor animosity from their "Move-In Day" protest (28 Jan 12) failure
 - Good weather anticipated on 25 Feb 12 (10% chance of rain, 58/40 degree High/Low temperatures)
- Factors that may indicate decreased crowd size:
 - OO's "End the Castlewood Lockout March." Pleasanton, 25 Feb 12, 0930. Plan is to occupy an area adjacent to the Castlewood Country Club. This event may draw from the FTP march.

Mission

On 25 Feb 12 at approximately 2100 hrs, OPD facilitates protestors' march from its start point to the PAB, and other possible locations in downtown Oakland. This will be done in order to:

1. Maintain officer safety
2. Protect life
3. Protect property
4. Protect vital facilities
5. Uphold Constitutional rights of free speech and lawful assembly

Commander's Intent

Purpose:

- To facilitate a lawful march and rally in compliance with Training Bulletin III-G.
- Prevent protestor access to the PAB
- Prevent vandalism of downtown businesses.
- Any violent behavior and acts of vandalism will not be tolerated.

Commander's Intent

Key Tasks:

- Maintain minimum police contact with the protesters.
- Facilitate protesters' march, if necessary.
- Deny protester access to the PAB and its facilities.
- Respond rapidly to acts of violence and vandalism and arrest perpetrators.

Commander's Intent

End State:

- Protestors able to express 1st Amendment rights by conducting march.
- Police respond to acts of violence or vandalism by making rapid arrests.
- No officers are injured.
- Only reasonable force employed in mission execution.

Execution

Alpha Platoon:

- Initially establish security at the PAB.
- Be prepared to form skirmish lines in 700 blk of Broadway, 700 blk Washington, 400 blk 7th St, and 400 blk 6th St, in order to deny protester access to the PAB.
- On order, move from PAB to reinforce Bravo Platoon.
- Be prepared to quickly establish a platoon skirmish line blocking position in the event protesters must be contained.

Execution

Bravo Platoon:

- Initially stage in location close to FTP rally point.
- During march, loosely trail protesters with one van-mounted squad. Keep the other van mounted squads in trail or parallel (and out of sight).
- If crowd begins vandalism, dismount all squads and trail closely, on foot.
- Be prepared to quickly establish a platoon skirmish line blocking position in the event protesters must be contained.

Execution

TNT:

- On order, make Unlawful Assembly announcements
- Monitor protestor websites and Twitter feeds
- Email Situational Updates to Commanders

Execution

Motors:

- Lead the march
- On order, establish traffic blocks

ARGUS:

- Stage at Oakland International Airport
- On order, respond to march
- Provide overhead updates on march movement

TOST:

- Dispatch off TAC 3 (MFF) and TAC 7 (Intel) channels

Execution

Complaint Unit:

- On order, respond to field locations to intake complaints

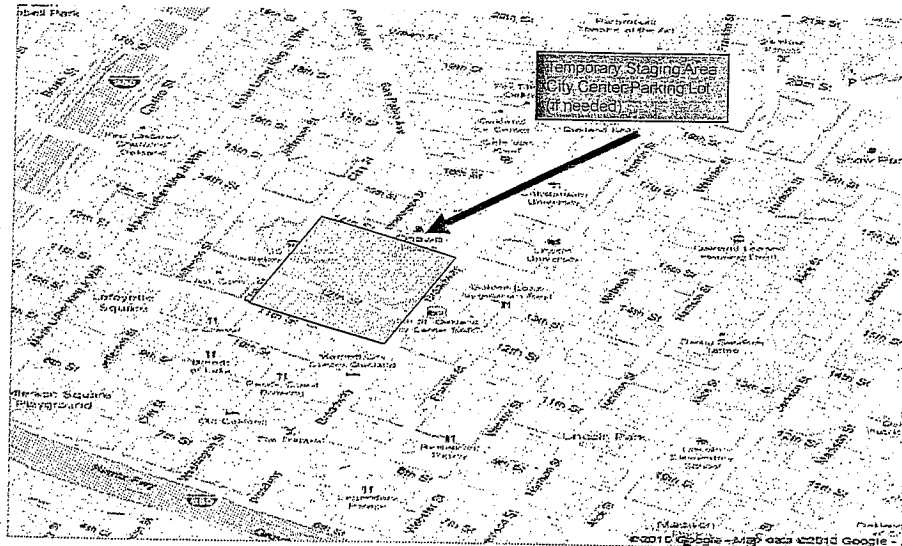
Video Unit:

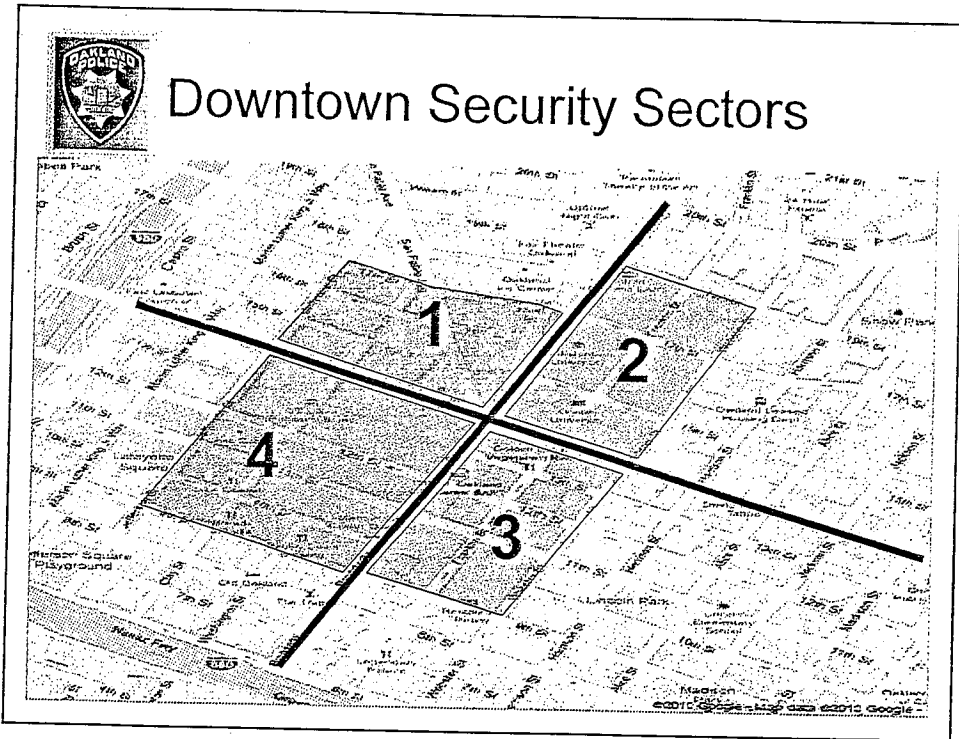
- Capture video footage of protesters from their rally at FOP to throughout the march route

Force & Arrest Posture

- OPD may encounter non-violent passive resistors (i.e. individuals that go limp). The following techniques shall be used (TB III-G):
 - Handcuffing
 - Verbal Persuasion
 - Lifting, carrying, use of dollies or stretchers
 - Use of control holds when approved by a sergeant
- OPD may encounter individuals who lock arms. Officers shall inform each individual that they are under arrest and provide verbal direction to give the arrestee a chance to comply before force is used to unlock arms
- Persons who make it clear (e.g. sitting down, locking arms) that they seek to be arrested shall be arrested and not subject to other dispersal techniques, such as the use of batons or chemical agents

Force & Arrest Posture

- OPD will target specific and identified agitators for immediate arrest within the crowd
- Tango teams will identify and target active/violent resistors within crowd for arrest (targeted deployment of LLDS rounds for immediate threat to life or serious bodily injury or substantial destruction of property which creates an imminent risk to life)
- OPD will provide unlawful assembly announcement (if needed)
- OPD will engage in arrests of remaining protesters who do not disperse pursuant to announcement
- The use of chemical agents may be used if authorized by field commanders
- Tasers and Aerosol Handheld Chemical Agents (OC) may not be used indiscriminately against crowds but only against individuals engaged in serious unlawful conduct or who are actively resisting (TB III-G)

Execution Time Line

- 25 Feb 12/1800 – Briefing at PAB
- 25 Feb 12/1845 – Deploy to initial positions
- 25 Feb 12/1900 – Intel/TNT determines protestor rally location
- 25 Feb 12/2100 – Facilitate march
- TBD – On order mission
- TBD – Demobilization

Media

- The media has right to be at protests and riots
- They are free to move where ever they want
- Leave the media alone and focus on protesters and those committing criminal acts
- When in doubt, "Let the media film"
- If they ask for a statement/questions, direct them to the PIO

Administration Report Writing

- If necessary, Sgt Mausz will be UOF report writer
- If necessary, Sgt Porritt will be the Primary Crime report writer
- All personnel will be required to complete a supplemental report if law enforcement action is taken (paper reports, not FBR)
- Stop Data reporting is suspended for MFF operations
- PDRDs are to be worn. During MFF operations, activate when directly engaged with crowd

Administration

- Complaints will be taken by the IAD stand-by team
- Statistical data forms (DDACTS) will be completed (one per car)
- Statistical data forms will be turned into each Platoon Leader by Squad Leaders, for an After Action Report
- Mass OT forms will be turned into each Platoon Leader by Squad Leaders

Equipment

- Long sleeve BDU' s
- Riot helmet w/#s attached (wear)
- Long baton (carry)
- Gas mask with holder (carry)
- At least four flex cuffs per officer (serial #s)
- Safety Glasses
- Prisoner wagon - have cuff cutters on hand
- Use minimum police cars (3-4 R/Os per car)
- Vans: 2 for Alpha Plt, 4 for Bravo Plt

- No police vehicles are to be left unattended IFO the PAB. They shall be placed in the covert lot.
