San Pablo Avenue Bikeway Improvement Project


DESCRIPTION

The City of Oakland is seeking public input on upgrading the existing signage-only bikeway on San Pablo Ave by adding pavement markings between 16th and 32nd Sts, as recommended in the City's Bicycle Master Plan. The bikeway improvements are planned for installation in fall 2010 as part of a paving project funded by the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (Federal Stimulus Program). New City-standard bicycle wayfinding signage will later replace the existing numbered signs, providing more detailed destination and directional information.


No parking spaces or travel lanes would be removed as part of this project.

GEOGRAPHIC CONTEXT

The San Pablo Avenue Bikeway
Improvement Project would complete 1.2
miles in the City's bikeway network. The
bikeway improvements on San Pablo Ave
would facilitiate bicycle commuting between
northwest Oakland/Emeryville and downtown
Oakland's two BART stations, businesses, workplaces, and civic buildings, and via connecting
bikeways to Lake Merritt and points east. As
shown in the Project Area Map, the improved
bikeway would intersect with existing bikeways
on Market St, West St, 27th St, W Grand Ave,
20th St and Martin Luther King Jr Way, and
with other bikeways pending construction or
under development.



POLICY



FEASIBILITY & SAFETY

San Pablo Ave is a key corridor connecting downtown, Emeryville, the Golden Gate neighborhood, and West Berkeley. Because of Oakland's irregular street grid, there are limited parallel routes and thus many roadway users travel on San Pablo Ave. This bikeway improvement project will ultimately connect to Emeryville's bikeway network via 32nd St and Hollis St, providing the first viable alternative to San Pablo Ave for bicyclists riding out of downtown Oakland.

To improve bicycle access and safety, the project will add shared roadway bicycle markings (aka "sharrows," pictured right) in the rightmost travel lane. Sharrows encourage bicyclists to ride clear of the "door zone," and advise motorists to expect and share the road with bicyclists. See cross sections on the reverse. 

Center Median/ Tum Pockets

Between 16th and 19th Sts, the travel and parking lane configuration of San Pablo Ave changes block by block. The design in this area will maintain sharrows in the outside through lane.

There are three segments of San Pablo Ave that are wider than typical. This extra width will allow bike lanes to be installed: (1) between 30th and Market Sts, southbound; (2) under the I-980 overpass in both directions; and (3) between Castro St and Martin Luther King Jr Way, southbound.
