2nd Street Bikeway Improvement Project

DESCRIPTION

The City of Oakland is seeking public input on proposed upgrades to the existing signageonly bikeway on 2nd St, Brush St to Oak St. The project, recommended in the City's Bicycle Master Plan (BMP), is planned for completion in 2011, and would be funded by Federal Stimulus funds for energy efficiency from the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act. The BMP calls for the installation of bikeways throughout Oakland to encourage bicycling as a healthy, non-polluting and affordable transportation option, helping Oakland to realize its sustainability and livability goals.

GEOGRAPHIC CONTEXT

The 2nd Street Bikeway Improvement Project would improve a one-mile link in the City's bikeway network (and part of the on-street San Francisco Bay Trail) that links Emeryville to Jack

London Square, and further east to Alameda and Fruitvale BART. The project also includes a short connecting segment on Brush St to the existing bikeway on 3rd St, and one block of bike lanes on Clay St (2nd St-Embarcadero) to improve bicycle access to the Oakland Ferry.

FEASIBILITY & SAFETY

The project would install shared roadway bicycle markings (aka "sharrows," pictured right) and parking edgeline stripes on 2nd St, Brush St-Oak St, and Brush St, 2nd-3rd Sts, to facilitate safe road sharing by motorists and bicyclists. The sharrow improves safety by encouraging bicyclists to ride clear of the "door zone," and advising motorists to expect bicyclists. (Learn more about the sharrow at www.tinyurl. com/36s6ms.) The edgeline stripe encourages

> motorists to park close to the curb, to maximize the travel way width for all.

Clay St currently has one wide travel lane in each direction, and bike lanes fit within the existing cross section. No travel lanes or parking spaces would be removed as part of this project. See design examples on the reverse.








