## 32nd-Hollis Streets Bikeway Project

### **DESCRIPTION**

The City of Oakland is proposing to install a new bikeway on 32nd St from San Pablo Ave to Mandela Parkway, and on Hollis St from 32nd St to the Emeryville border. The project, recommended in the City's Bicycle Master Plan (BMP), is planned for completion in 2011. It would be funded by Oakland's share of Measure B, the Alameda County Transportation Improvement Authority's half-cent sales tax, using revenues solely dedicated to bicycle and pedestrian projects.

The BMP calls for the installation of bikeways throughout Oakland to encourage bicycling as a healthy, non-polluting and affordable transportation option, helping Oakland to realize its sustainability and livability goals.

#### **GEOGRAPHIC CONTEXT**

The 32nd-Hollis Streets Bikeway

Project would complete a one-mile link in the City's bikeway network, connecting to existing bikeways on Mandela Pkwy and 40th St in Emeryville. The project would also connect to a bikeway pending construction on San Pablo Ave, creating a continuous connection to downtown Oakland.

#### **FEASIBILITY & SAFETY**

The project would install shared roadway bicycle markings (aka "sharrows") along the corridor. The sharrow, pictured right, improves safety by encouraging bicyclists to ride clear of the "door zone," and advising motorists to expect bicyclists. (Learn more about the sharrow at

www.tinyurl.com/36s6ms.) The project would also add bicycle wayfinding signs providing destination and distance information. Sharrows and wayfinding signage are two elements of a "bicycle boulevard," a bicycle route on local streets that prioritize through trips for bicyclists. Bike lanes would be installed on Hollis St from the Emeryville border to W MacArthur Blvd. No travel lanes or parking spaces would be removed as part of this project.
