10th St Bikeway Project, Madison St to 9th Ave

DESCRIPTION

The City of Oakland is developing a project to improve and extend the bike lanes on 10th St between Madison St and 9th Ave. The project is planned for construction in early 2017 as part of the completion of the 10th St Bridge Project at the Lake Merritt Channel. The bikeway project is funded by Measures B and BB, the countywide transportation sales taxes administered by the Alameda County Transportation Commission, using revenues dedicated solely to bicyclist and pedestrian projects.

The City of Oakland's Bicycle Master Plan calls for the installation of bikeways throughout Oakland to encourage bicycling as a healthy, non-polluting and affordable transportation option, helping Oakland to realize its sustainability and livability goals.


GEOGRAPHIC CONTEXT

The 10th St Bikeway Project will complete a 0.9-mile link in the City's bikeway network connecting downtown Oakland to neighborhoods east of Lake Merritt. The project will connect to an existing bikeway on 4th Ave/5th Ave and a newly constructed bikeway on Madison St/Oak St across the length of downtown. The 10th St Bikeway Project is part of the draft alignment for the East Bay Greenway, a planned 16-mile regional trail that would extend from downtown Oakland to South Hayward generally along the alignment of the BART tracks.

DESIGN

The 10th St Bikeway Project includes the following components. It will make minor improvements to the bike lanes that were installed in 2014 from Madison St to the Lake Merritt Channel and from 4th Ave to 5th Ave. It will close the gap in the bike lanes between 2nd Ave and 4th Ave that was created by the Oakland Unified School District's

construction project of the Downtown Educational Complex. It will extend the bike lanes from 5th Ave to 9th Ave (at E 8th St). A future project will connect the 10th St Bikeway to the E 12th St Bikeway via E 8th St (9th Ave to 14th Ave). The 10th St Bikeway Project includes spot repairs to the pavement throughout the project area.
