



# **Existing Conditions and Key Issues Report and Market Opportunity Analysis**

#### **Planning Area Demographics**

- Existing Households in Planning Area 2009: 6,159
- Small household size 1.94 persons/ HH
  - compared to Oakland's average 2.65 / HH
- HH income is lower than that of Oakland
  - About 33% of households have an income of less than \$15,000, compared to 13% in Oakland
- 30% of the population is age 60 or older
- 64% of the population is Asian/Pacific Islander, of which 84% are Chinese










#### **Historic Location of Chinatown**




