### **SUMMARY**

The Wonderarium, a creation of artists Sarah Filley and Yvette Molina, is an eight foot floating terrarium art project proposed to be temporarily installed in Lake Merritt approximately 100 feet off the Lake Merritt shoreline between the Lake Chalet and Camron-Stanford House. Installation of the project is proposed to take place summer 2012 and remain installed for up to twelve months.

### FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the City. The project has a preliminary budget of \$90,000 which will be raised by the Artists. The Office of Parks and Recreation (OPR) will provide limited assistance in the coordination of the installation and removal of the project from the Lake. Building, construction and dismantle of the project including all maintenance will be performed by Artists. OPR will provide complimentary muscle powered boats to Artist to allow access to the project for routine watering and maintenance.

### BACKGROUND AND PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Wonderarium is a floating botanical terrarium filled with drought tolerant terrarium appropriate plant life. Inside a clear eight foot acrylic sphere, small solar panels will absorb the suns rays during the day and LED lights will illuminate the flora by night. The project is designed to promote ecological awareness and foster community through events and workshops in partnership with existing institutions and organizations around the Lake. The Wonderarium will sit on a floating dock platform anchored to the bottom of Lake Merritt just off the shallow shelf of the shore, yet away from boat traffic.

The artists propose integrating community, education and volunteer groups in the experience of creating and maintaining the Wonderarium. Through partnerships with the Lake Merritt Institute and the Lake Merritt Boating Center the artist will boat to the sphere for bi-weekly watering and maintenance. If necessary the Wonderarium can be towed to the 1520 Lakeside Drive Pier for "as needed" larger maintenance requirements.

The Wonderarium project was presented as an informational report to the Public Art Advisory Committee (PAAC) on April 12, 2010 and received committee support. The project will return to PAAC for approval once funding is secured.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission support the Wonderarium Art Project and accept this informational report.



## WONDERARIUM

### MAINTENANCE PLAN:

We propose integrating community, education, and volunteer groups in our maintenance plan. Partnering with the Boating Center and Lake Merritt Institute, we will boat out to the sphere for bi-weekly maintenance.

In addition, we propose unlatching WONDERARIUM from its anchor and floating it to the Lake Chalet dock on an "as needed" basis for hose down cleanings and pop-up maintenance concerns.



### WONDERARIUM Maintenance Checklist

### Dock Inspection:

- DRemove trash and debris
- UScrub down algae, barnacle build-up, bird droppings
  - Check dock lights
- Replace as needed monofilament bird deterrent


### Sphere Inspection:

- Clean dirt/bird droppings with damp cloth or squeegee
  - UCheck solar panels, LED lights, and connections
    - **J**Water plants as needed
- Replace netting over ventilation opening as needed
  - Clear blocked drainage holes

Cleaning of WONDERARIUM will be done with fresh water, towels, scrub brushes and scrapers.

All cleaning agents will be non-toxic and biodegradable.

### **SUMMARY**

North Oakland Community Charter School (NOCCS) located at 1000 42<sup>nd</sup> Street between Adeline and Market and next to Linden Park has adopted Linden Park through the Public Work's Agency "Adopt a Spot" program and have a long-term relationship with and feel a responsibility towards the Park. NOCCS would like to beautify a short concrete retaining wall surrounding the play structure (see Exhibit A) by building a tile mosaic on the wall incorporating 100 peace themed tiles created by the community during the recent Cesar Chavez Community Service Day.

### FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the City of Oakland. NOCCS has received donations of tiles and other materials needed from their school community, neighborhood, and local tile stores. NOCCS received a City of Oakland - Artists in the Schools Program grant which is helping to fund the mosaic project. NOCCS will continue to apply for other grants and fundraise until the project is fully funded. NOCCS will take full responsibility for the maintenance of the mural, including repair and or replacement of broken tiles and graffiti removal as they have adopted Linden Park and will care for all aspects of it. NOCCS has already installed a compost bin, planted flowers, weeded gardens, picked up litter and cleaned graffiti in Linden Park. NOCCS will continue discussions with OPR and the Public Works Agency for advise on how best to maintain the mural.

### BACKGROUND

The 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade classes at NOCCS have been involved in a Service Learning Project that was designed to build connections with their neighborhood. At the beginning of the school year, students, parents and staff walked the community and recorded their observations as they mapped the neighborhood looking for assets. Community members were interviewed to discover more about the needs of the neighborhood and to help students develop projects that would benefit the community and build connections between the neighborhood and NOCCS. The projects were presented to a panel of community members with positive and negative feedback received and incorporated into the final projects.

The Community Art Group consisting of 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade students along with the Community Art Group teacher and several knowledgeable volunteers including Winoka Turin, parent and art teacher at NOCCS and Marin School and Gina Dominquez of Snapshots Mosaic, participated in the Service Learning Project and are proposing to create a community tile mosaic in the park

dedicated to peace. It is the hope of NOCCS to bring the neighborhood community together through the creation of the peace mosaic.

The Community Art Group envisions a rainbow mosaic on the horizontal seat surface (see Exhibit A) with the peace tiles on the vertical sides of the concrete wall. Elliptical and round glass pieces along with smaller pieces of tile will be used to connect the sides to the top and used to fill in the space between the peace tiles. Since the retaining wall surrounds a toddler play structure all mosaic pieces will be smooth and safe for a child's touch. This design was presented to and approved by the Public Art Advisory Committee on May 3, 2010.

NOCCS plans on completing the first half of the tile mosaic before the end of the 2009-2010 school year and have sufficient peace tiles for this purpose. NOCCS will host a second community event next fall where additional blank tiles would be decorated to enable NOCCS to finish the peace mosaic.

### RECOMMENDATION





Parking went very smoothly last year thanks to OPR/Public Works allowing event workers to park on the service road and

behind the Garden Center. May we have access to the service road and area behind the Garden Center again this year? We are likely to see many more attendees this year.

and Installation of the 'Remember Them' Monument

#### SUMMARY.

The Oakland Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce Foundation (OMCCF) Board is asking Staff request Council adopt a resolution to re-name the Fox Square Park located at 1900 Rashida Muhammad Street to the Henry J. Kaiser Memorial Park in response to a significant donation from Kaiser Permanente for the completion of the 'Remember Them' Monument which will be located in the park.

This request aligns with Resolution No. 65024 C.M.S. (see *Exhibit A*), Resolution Approving and Adopting a Procedure for Designating Official Names for Municipal (Public) Facilities in the City of Oakland, No. 4b, an individual philanthropist, and family or estate name.

### FISCAL IMPACT

There is no expected fiscal impact the City. The Oakland Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce Foundation and Kaiser Permanente will seek funding for signage and the 'Remember Them' project includes a maintenance endowment which will ensure that the bronze monument is insured for damage and cleaned annually.

### BACKGROUND

In 2006 City Council unanimously approved Resolution No. 80123 C.M.S (see *Exhibit B*) placing the 'Remember Them' Monument in the Fox Square Park.

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The 'Remember Them' monument is an inspirational bronze monument comprised of 25 International role models that includes an educational program. The high school curriculum was developed by the Martin Luther King Institute at Stanford University and is currently being tested in Oakland Unified Schools. The project also includes artwork for the visually impaired to provide an equal experience. The monument is ADA accessible.

### KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The total budget for the 'Remember Them' project which includes the bronze monument, educational component, visually impaired artwork, site work maintenance endowments is approximately \$7 million of which we have raised \$3.2 million to date. Kaiser donated

\$1 million initially to start the project and is now pledging \$2 million and is committed to assisting the OMCCF raise an additional \$2 million. Because of the significant donations by Kaiser Permanente, the project is anticipated to be completed in 12 months after the funds are confirmed in early June of 2010 by the Kaiser Permanente Board of Directors.

### SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: Naming of the park after Henry J. Kaiser, a well-known philanthropist and largest employer of Oakland, is in line with the Monument theme of acknowledging individuals who did extraordinary things for the betterment of other people. Mr. Kaiser was one of the first major National employers to implement equal rights for all people during a time of segregation as well as a health program for employees. Because of the uplifting themes associated with Henry J. Kaiser and 'Remember Them', the park and monument will provide an opportunity to attract tourists from all over the world to the area bringing economic benefit to Oakland. This will potentially increase revenue for the City through parking as well as provide business for local restaurants, hotels and retailers.

Environmental: The proposed naming has no impact on social equity.

Social Equity: The proposed naming has no impact on social equity.

### **DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS**

Proposed re-naming of the park has no impact for disabled and senior citizens.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission accept this informational report.

- Any individual or entity may initiate a proposal to name or rename a public facility in the City of Oakland.
- 2. All requests for naming and renaming public facilities in the City of Oakland shall be transmitted to the Rules and Procedures/Legislative Committee, including requests by:
  - (a) individuals and public officials;
  - (b) clubs, civic groups, or neighborhood organizations;
  - (c) public agencies or governmental entities.
- 3. Any request to name or rename park and recreation facilities shall be referred to, or may be initiated by, the Oakland Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (OPRAC). The recommendation of the OPRAG shall be referred to the Rules and Procedures/Legislative Committee.
- 4. The Rules and Procedures/Legislative Committee shall review all requests and recommend an appropriate name to the City Council. Special consideration will be rendered based upon the following criteria:
  - (a) a geographical area of the City or a significant historical event;
  - (b) an individual philanthropist, family, or estate name;
  - (c) unique or civic circumstances;

- (d) memorialization of a living person, only under special circumstances as follows:
  - the honoree contributed half or more of the cost of a major facility;
  - o the honoree initiated or contributed major time to the establishment of the project;
  - overwhelming belief (public opinion) that the designee would probably be honored for that facility posthumously;
  - if no other individual now living has, or is likely to have, greater public support for being honored at this specific site;
  - the honoree has given extraordinary service to the City or the community;
  - the honoree has attained national or international prominence and achievement.

Upon approval, the City shall limit its recognition of an honoree to one facility or portion thereof. Further, facilities named for a specific individual should rarely be renamed, although the City Council could be flexible in renaming facilities originally named for geographical areas, etc. A public hearing shall be conducted by the City Council prior to the official designation of any name for a public facility.
