The following is a summary, background, discussion and staff recommendations regarding the subject appeal of a tree removal permit determination.

SUMMARY

The Tree Services Division approved the tree permit to remove two trees at 5710 Margarido Drive, and denied the removal of one other tree requested by the applicant. The property owner/applicant has appealed staff's decision.

BACKGROUND

On July 7, 2010, Pamela Llewellyn of Professional Tree Care Company, agent for the property owner, submitted an application the Tree Services to remove three redwood trees. The application states their reason for removal as:

"Potential hazard to property, proximity to existing structures, damage to outdoor structure"

On August 9, 2010, the Tree Services Division made a permit decision allowing the removal of two redwoods and the preservation of one redwood. The two redwoods approved are adjacent to the retaining wall and could cause damage in the future.

On August 17, 2010, Pamela Llewellyn (agent for appellant) for 5710 Margarido Drive, appealed staff's decision. The basis for the appeal was stated as follows:

"The coast redwoods, planted by our client, are not appropriate trees for this location. Trees are producing the typical amount of debris expected by these trees, which is unacceptable to our client. In addition to the debris, the dew falling from the trees is staining the patio and patio furniture. Leaving one of these trees will soon produce the

same effect she is having now. We would like to remove all the trees and replace them with something more appropriate for this location".

DISCUSSION

The Protected Tree Ordinance (PTO), Section 12.36.050 of the OMC, lists the criteria used to decide if trees should be removed or preserved. Decision making for tree removals is a two-step process:

Step 1: Applications are reviewed to see if they accomplish at least one of five possible objectives. It has been determined that your permit application does not meet any of the five objectives.

Step 2: Even if the tree qualifies for a removal objective, preservation is required if at least one of four possible grounds for denial applies to the situation. The Tree Services Division position is there are no grounds for denial:

• The Tree Services supports criterion 12.36.050 (B) of the Tree Preservation Ordinance which states, "Trimming, thinning, tree surgery or other reasonable treatment".

Section 12.36.11 (C) of the Ordinance states, "In considering the appeal, the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission shall determine whether the proposed tree removal conforms to the applicable criteria. The decision of the Tree Services can be sustained or require such changes or impose such reasonable conditions of approval as are, in its judgment, necessary to ensure conformity and said criteria".

RECOMMENDATION

The Public Works Agency recommends that the Park and Recreation Commission:

- Deny the appeal by Pamela Llewellyn; and
- Instruct staff to issue tree permit application ND10-057 for 5710 Margarido Drive, upholding staff's decision to require preservation of one redwood and allowing the applicant to remove two redwood trees, #1 and #2 on the site plan.

The following is a summary, background, discussion and staff recommendations regarding the subject appeal of a tree removal permit determination.

SUMMARY

The Tree Services Division denied the tree permit to remove one tree coast live oak tree growing in front of the yard of a home at 5452 Carlton Street. The property owner/applicant has appealed staff's decision.

BACKGROUND

On June 25, 2010, Robert Hemmer submitted an application to the Tree Services to remove one coast live oak tree. The application states their reason for removal as:

"Too close to house; blocks view and light, roots getting into our drainage system."

On August 2, 2010, the Tree Services Division denied the removal of the tree because the removal of this healthy tree could be avoided by trimming, thinning, tree surgery or other reasonable treatment.

On August 4, 2010, Robert Hemmer (appellant), property owner of 5452 Carlton Street, appealed staff's decision. The basis for the appeal was stated as follows:

DISCUSSION

The Protected Tree Ordinance (PTO), Section 12.36.050 of the OMC, lists the criteria used to decide if trees should be removed or preserved. Decision making for tree removals is a two-step process:

Step 1: Applications are reviewed to see if they accomplish at least one of five possible objectives. It has been determined that your permit application does not meet any of the five objectives.

Step 2: Even if the tree qualifies for a removal objective, preservation is required if at least one of four possible grounds for denial applies to the situation. The Tree Services Division position is there are no grounds for denial:

• The Tree Services supports criterion 12.36.050 (B) of the Tree Preservation Ordinance which states, "Trimming, thinning, tree surgery or other reasonable treatment".

Section 12.36.11 (C) of the Ordinance states, "In considering the appeal, the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission shall determine whether the proposed tree removal conforms to the applicable criteria. The decision of the Tree Services can be sustained or require such changes or impose such reasonable conditions of approval as are, in its judgment, necessary to ensure conformity and said criteria".

RECOMMENDATION

The Public Works Agency recommends that the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission:

- Deny the appeal by Robert Hemmer; and
- Instruct staff to deny tree permit application ND10-059 for 5452 Carlton Street.

Robert Hemmer and Elizabeth Patelke 5452 Carlton St. Oakland, CA 94618

We appeal the Tree Removal Denial on these grounds:

- 1. <u>View</u>: The entire western view from our house (a major feature with both aesthetic and financial value) is nearly eliminated by this tree. Far from blocking only a "narrow, wedge-shaped view of the northern section of San Francisco Bay," the tree cuts out most of the view from all four front windows.
- 2. <u>Lollipop</u>: Your idea for trimming the tree will result in an unsightly "lollipop" shape which will have none of the grace and beauty typical of mature oaks.
- 3. Ongoing expense: Regular pruning of a tree this size will be very costly to us as it will need to be done frequently to maintain the view.
- 4. <u>Drainage</u>: We have had extensive (and expensive) drainage work done on our property. The tree has tapped into that water source and and is starting to push up the sidewalk and may damage our house foundation and our neighbors' driveway.
- 5. <u>Neighbors</u>: Our neighbors to the north (5460 Carlton St.) have lost the southern view from their front window. Their beautiful front garden is suffering from greatly reduced sunshine. In the winter months, when the sun is far to the south, their living room is cold and dark.

In sum, we request permission to remove this tree, which, although beautiful, is too big and aggressive for its location. I know that oak trees in Oakland are special, but that fact should not trump all other issues of cost, aesthetics, and appropriateness.

Photographs taken from our driveway can tell one story, but not the whole story. If you had come inside, you would see what we are dealing with every day.

The following is a summary, background, discussion and staff recommendations regarding the subject appeal of a tree removal permit determination.

SUMMARY

The Tree Services Division denied the tree permit to remove two Monterey cypress trees and one Birch. One Monterey cypress tree is growing in the front yard, the other on the west side of the home. The Birch tree is growing in the backyard, overhanging the corner of the carport at 12550 Skyline Blvd. The property owner/applicant has appealed staff's decision.

BACKGROUND

On July 14, 2010, Damon Charles & Andrew Levinson submitted an application to the Tree Services to remove two Monterey cypress and one Birch trees. The application states their reason for removal as:

"Two Cypress trees at front of properly and one Birch have created moisture from the weeping trees that has created thousands and thousands of dollars in damage by creating wet rot and black mold and green mold along the entire roof, eve, beams, and decking".

On August 2, 2010, the Tree Services Division denied the removal of the tree because the removal of this healthy tree could be avoided by trimming, thinning, tree surgery or other reasonable treatment.

On August 17, 2010, Damon Charles & Andrew Levinson (appellant), property owner of 12550 Skyline Blvd. appealed staff's decision. The basis for the appeal was stated as follows:

"We believe the inspector's decision was biased because of things he said immediately before the inspection, during the inspection and when done with the inspection. Damage to the house builds with every day the trees "weep" on the house and keep it moist by blocking any

sun. This house was built as a church in 1964-65 probably with no forethought that it would ever become a house, and that the trees could and would cause such damage. We should not be penalized for that".

DISCUSSION

The Protected Tree Ordinance (PTO), Section 12.36.050 of the OMC, lists the criteria used to decide if trees should be removed or preserved. Decision making for tree removals is a two-step process:

Step 1: Applications are reviewed to see if they accomplish at least one of five possible objectives, It has been determined that your permit application it does not meet any of the five objectives.

Step 2: Even if the tree qualifies for a removal objective, preservation is required if at least one of four possible grounds for denial applies to the situation. The Tree Services Division position is there are no grounds for denial:

• The Tree Services supports criterion 12.36.050 (B) of the (TPO) which states, "Trimming, thinning, tree surgery or other reasonable treatment".

Section 12.36.11 (C) of the TPO states, "In considering the appeal, the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission shall determine whether the proposed tree removal conforms to the applicable criteria. The decision of the Tree Services can be sustained or require such changes or impose such reasonable conditions of approval as are, in its judgment, necessary to ensure conformity and said criteria".

RECOMMENDATION

The Public Works Agency recommends that the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission:

- Deny the appeal by Damon Charles and Andrew Levinson; and
- Instruct staff to deny tree permit application ND10-065 for 12550 Skyline Blvd.

SUMMARY

The Office of Parks and Recreation has received a request from the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP), a 501c(3) non-profit foundation, to collect donations and sell t-shirts and other event related items on-site at the second annual Community Out of the Darkness Walk to be held at Lakeside Park on Saturday, October 16, 2010. Proceeds from the event will go towards suicide prevention and awareness.

FISCAL IMPACT

There will be no fiscal impact on the Office of Parks and Recreation.

BACKGROUND

This is the AFSP's second year hosting the event at Lakeside Park. There was no request submitted to accept donations on-site last year. Donations and other monies were accepted in advance of the event date.

The event will consist of participants representing survivors of suicide, who have collected sponsorship donations for the education and distribution of information about suicide awareness and prevention. One hundred percent of the proceeds will benefit the prevention and education about suicide with fifty percent of the funds retained locally for the Alameda County Crisis support and the local chapter of the AFSP.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request from the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention to collect sponsorship donations at the Community Out of the Darkness Walk at Lakeside Park on Saturday, October 16, 2010.

BACKGROUND

The African People's Education and Defense Fund (APEDF) is hosting the event to address the toxic mix of conditions that contribute to poor health in the African community of Oakland. The APEDF is collaborating with organizations like Kijiji Farms, Alameda County Department of Public Health, One Love, the Scraper Bikes Club, Peralta School District as well as health workers, artists, nutrition experts and a mobile clinic.

APEDF is ready to include vendors in order to cover the costs of hosting this event. They recognize that there are additional fees and permits involved with this. The prospective vendors will have jewelry, soaps and incense, food, oils, hair products and paintings. The APEDF expected turnout is between 200 and 300 people. Park security will be provided by the Uhuru Defense Force.

The APEDF have agreed to secure a one day food handlers permit, provide private security of which they have 30 years of experience and port-o-potties from an approved City of Oakland Vendor.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request to allow food and non-food vendors at the APEDF Uhuru Wellness Festival at Arroyo Viejo Park on Saturday, October 9, 2010. The APEDF is aware that additional permits are required prior to the issuance of their permit.

The African People's Education and Defense Fund (APEDF) is hosting "Uhuru Wellness Festival – Health Uprising" on Saturday, October 9, 2010 from 10am to 4pm at Arroyo Viejo Park in East Oakland. The festival is designed to educate, entertain, provide free services and mobilize the community to transformative action.

The idea for the Uhuru Wellness Festival evolved from the May 2010 collaborative forum between the APEDF and the Alameda County Department of Public Health (ACDPH) that addressed the unhealthy conditions for African people in Oakland. The ACDPH stated in their 2008 report *Life & Death from Unnatural Causes: Health and Social Inequity in Alameda County* that "a toxic mixture of conditions such as poverty, pollution, poor education, substandard housing, a shortage of grocery stores, cheap fast food, violence, unemployment and racism" contribute to the health inequities of the African community. In fact, an African person born in West Oakland can expect to die 15 years earlier than a white person born in the Oakland Hills.

The Uhuru Wellness Festival will provide a fun and safe environment for our Central East
Oakland community to address this reality. Some of the consolidated booths include:

- Black images in the media (arts and crafts and dialogue)
- "Try it, it's free" (nutrition and free food)
- "I'm pissed off because..." (art expression)
- Free health screenings (HIV, and others)
- Jessica Parker Acupuncture
- Oakland Discovery School (science and math for children)
- Kijiji Farms (alternative food growing techniques)
- Children's activities
- Black Organizing Project (voices of youth)
- Demonstrations of martial arts and Brazilian dance
- Presentation by Ironiff Ifoma, Nat'l President of APEDF

We are ready to include vendors in order to cover the costs of hosting this event. We recognize that there are additional fees and permits involved with this. The prospective vendors will have jewelry, soaps and incense, food, oils, hair products and paintings.

We will secure a one day food handlers permit and port-o-potties. Any information regarding subsidization of the toilets will be appreciated.
