# SUMMARY

# FISCAL IMPACT

# BACKGROUND

This is the Native American Health Center's 10<sup>th</sup> year hosting the event at Lakeside Park. The Native American Health Center request has come before the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission in the past and was granted approval to collect registration/donation fees. All past events were successful and went as planned. In 2011, the organization collected \$2,155 on-site for registration/donation fees.

There are no significant changes for this year. Staff will work closely with the organization to ensure another successful event. The on-site fees will once again be \$15 for adults and \$5 for children. The fees collected will be used to support the event (i.e., purchasing t-shirts and supporting participant walking and running scholarships.)

This letter is to inform you that we will be allowing our community members the opportunity to register on the day of the event. This is our 10th annual event and we have always offered same day registration that has allowed us to gain larger participation. We encourage on-line pre-registration, but same day registration is also necessary. The same day registration fees will be \$15 for adults and \$5 for children. **SUMMARY** 

The Office of Parks and Recreation received a request from Women's Daytime Drop-in Center, a non-profit organization, for approval to collect entrance fees and funds from a live and silent auction at Sequoia Lodge on Sunday, May 20, 2012. The funds raised will provide financing for the Center's day support and housing services which help over 1200 individuals each year.

The representatives for the Women's Daytime Drop-in Center are not in attendance due to the Post Event Report provided to staff.

## FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact on the Office of Parks and Recreation.

## BACKGROUND

Women's Daytime Drop-in Center, a non-profit organization, has been serving homeless and atrisk women and children in Northern Alameda County for the past 24 years. The organization hosted the same event last year. They collected \$3,000 on site from the event and raised approximately \$25,000 for the agency. The request this year is similar to last year's event.

This event is the Center's primary fundraising effort for the year. They hope to raise \$25,000 again this year. Guests will be asked to pay \$45-\$50 to attend the event that will be collected at the door. Auction items will include donated vacation packages, gift cards for restaurants, theatre tickets, art objects, costume jewelry, handmade items and donated services. The winning bidders will pay for their items by check or charge.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request from Women's Daytime Drop-in Center to collect entrance fees and funds from the live and silent auction during their event at Sequoia Lodge on Sunday, May 20, 2012. The contact person is aware that additional permits are required for this event provided the request is granted.

## BACKGROUND

In late 2004, Council directed staff to develop a method of prioritizing parks capital projects. Staff presented a report in Feb. 2005 outlining comprehensive processes to prioritize park projects in conformance to City's General Plan Element (OSCAR). Due to limited funds and resources, Council directed staff to utilize an alternative, cost-effective method of developing a prioritization list based on adopted evaluation criteria to assess a limited number of priority sites. In Dec. 2006, staff presented the evaluation findings and proposed park project prioritization rankings. Through further Council reviews, Council re-directed staff to prioritize the list utilizing three sub-groups, establishing top 3 priority projects in each district. The first prioritization list was then adopted in December 2007. Council required that staff update the list bi-annually for approval. The proposed list is the update for FY 2011-13.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission accepts the report.

### **SUMMARY**

This report requests approval of a resolution to adopt the updated FY 2011-2013 Park Project Prioritization List as a part of the on-going park capital improvement project plan in accordance with the Open Space, Conservation, and Recreation (OSCAR) Element of the Oakland General Plan and subsequent policies adopted by Council.

On December 11, 2007, Council approved the initial FY 2007-2009 Park Project Prioritization List and directed staff to return on a two-year cycle to update the list. An updated list was adopted for the FY2009-2011 budget cycle in December 2009. Staff is submitting an updated project prioritization list for FY 2011-2013 for approval as projects are being completed and new projects are proposed (see *Attachment A*).

Staff requests that Council approve the resolution establishing the FY 2011-2013 Park Project Prioritization List. The Park Project Prioritization List will continue to serve as the guiding plan for park project capital improvement program.

## FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of the attached resolutions will establish the proposed park capital improvement project priorities.

No direct maintenance and operation fiscal impacts are associated with this report until the projects are funded and implemented. In general park capital improvement projects help to improve deferred maintenance issues. However, new and expanded facilities often increase maintenance requirements due to increased use or expanded areas and facilities. When funds are available to implement a specific project, an evaluation of the impact of the project on maintenance and operation costs will be made.

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### **BACKGROUND**

On December 11, 2007, Council approved the Park Project Prioritization List in Resolution No. 81021 C.M.S. The purpose of the prioritization list is to serve as the guiding plan for implementing Oakland's parks and open space capital improvements, or allow staff to expedite the process in applying for grant funds. Only projects on the Prioritization List may be submitted for grants. The Council also directed staff to return to Council to update the prioritization list on a two- year cycle in conjunction with the budget process.

The project list allows staff to seek fund opportunities and apply appropriate grant criteria to appropriate projects based on the prioritization. The City has successfully applied for and received several grants for park projects in the past budget cycle based on the list. In addition, Measure WW East Bay Regional Park Bond provided funds to complete several projects as well.

### Grants received:

- \$7.2 million from Proposition 84 Safe Drinking Water, Water Quality and Supply, Flood Control, River and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2006 Statewide Park Grant for the West Oakland Teen Center and the Cesar Chavez Park Improvement projects.
- \$200,000 from Stewardship Council Infrastructure Improvement Grant for Lincoln Square Park Alice St. Recreation Corridor Improvements

Park Prioritization Projects from FY 2009-2011 completed or fully funded:

- 25<sup>th</sup> St. Mini Park
- Morcom Rose Garden Improvements
- Cesar Chavez Park Improvements
- West Oakland Teen Center
- Leveling Playing Fields

In addition, Council have authorized staff under Resolution 83367 CMS in May, 2011 to apply for, accept, and appropriate another six park prioritization projects for the second round of the Proposition 84 Statewide Park Grant. The grant results are anticipated in early spring 2012.

## KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

As priority projects are funded or completed and moved off the list, Public Works staff, working with the Office of Parks and Recreation and Council Offices, have identified several new projects to add to the Park Project Prioritization List.

Several of the proposed projects will require conceptual design development, community outreach and project development for potential grant opportunities. Having these projects on the list allows staff to seek funds to develop and implement the projects.

The list allows a clear document of the City's current priority for park improvements.

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The goal of the Park Project Prioritization List is to serve as the guiding plan for implementing Oakland's parks and open space capital improvements and allow staff to expedite the process in applying for grant funds matching the project needs. Proposed park capital projects are analyzed based on OSCAR policy and recommendations to protect and maximize existing park assets and Council's adopted criteria in Resolution 78744 CMS (July, 2004) to prioritize city facilities and infrastructures, as well as input from Office of Parks and Recreation and Council Offices. Below are brief descriptions of the new projects that are proposed for the updated Park Project Prioritization List.

- Golden Gate Community Recreation Center Expansion: Expansion of the existing recreation center to create new program spaces with new gymnasium, multi-purpose rooms, technology/computer room, outdoor play area, amphitheater, and track path.
- Mazanita Park and Recreation Center Improvements: Renovation, expansion, and improvements to the existing park and aging recreation center.
- Lowell Park Improvements: Community process and concept plan development required.
- Maxwell Park Improvements: Community-led park plan developed for the park renovation. The proposed improvements include upgrading the tot lot, adding a new tot lot serving children ages 5-12, new swings, new performing/seating area, a new butterfly garden, and improve pathway access, entryway, fencing, landscaping, and picnic area.
- Jungle Hill Park Improvements: Community desired park improvement to provide resting/overlook seating area, fitness exercise equipment, improved lighting, and accessible pathways for park users from the top to the lower hillside.

## SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

*Economic*: Park capital improvement projects will improve the economic value of the surrounding neighborhoods by providing open recreational spaces.

Environmental: In general, park capital improvement projects will promote environmental goals, conserve natural resources, and maintain existing natural and park assets.

Social Equity: Park capital improvement projects will provide recreational and open space amenities to youths, seniors, and communities at large.

## DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

There are no direct disability and senior access opportunities associated with this report.

However, as projects are implemented, each project will provide direct benefits by improving access to City parks, facilities, and programs for seniors and persons with disabilities.

## RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

It is recommended that Council approve the proposed resolution to adopt the updated FY 2011-2013 Park Project Prioritization List and continue to update the list in conjunction with the budget bi-annual cycle.

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## ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the proposed resolution adopting the updated Park Project Prioritization List for FY2011-2013.
