The Office of Parks and Recreation received a request from the Native American Health Center seeking permission to collect on-site registration/donation fees for their Running is My High Walkathon, a 10k and 5k fun race around Lake Merritt on Saturday, March 9, 2012.

8. NEW BUSINESS:

A. Request for the Parks & Rec. Advisory Commission to Approve the Sale of Tickets, and Participation Fees for Dance Competition. Donte Watson presented the staff report for Item 8A. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission reviewed a request from the Filoso Studios Dance Academy, a local cultural dance organization. Event organizers requested permission for the Office of Parks and Recreation's Ira Jinkins Recreation Center to collect participant and entry fees at their November 24, 2012 Dance Competition to be held at Ira Jinkins Recreation Center. The Filoso Studios Dance Academy is one of the foremost groups in the Bay Area practicing the Quebradita Mexican style of dance. The estimated average attendance at each event is 400 to 500 persons. The November 24th competition is the third event of this kind to be held at Ira Jinkins. Event organizers were requested to complete a post event report.

B. Request Approval from the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission to Allow Tamu Orphans Support Fund to Sell Food, Wine, African Artifacts, Collect Entry Fees and Host an Auction and Raffle at their Crab Feed to be Held at the Lake Merritt Sailboat House on Saturday, January 26, 2013. Gail McMillon presented the following staff report. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission reviewed a request from the Tamu Orphans Support Fund, a non-profit organization, seeking permission to sell food, wine, African artifacts, collect entry fees and host an auction and raffle at their Crab Feed scheduled to be held at the Lake Merritt Sailboat House on Saturday, January 26, 2013. All proceeds will go to benefit AIDS orphaned and vulnerable children supported by the Tamu Orphans Support Fund. The program currently supports 5 children at a cost of \$200.00 a month per child or \$2,400.00 annually. Program organizers have identified another 6 children waiting for services and community home placement.

C. Request for the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission to Accept the Design for

the Linden Park Improvements. Mark Hall presented the staff report for Item 8C. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission reviewed a request from the Office of Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission to accept the design improvements to Linden Park. Over time, deferred maintenance and heavy use has turned the Linden Park field into a dirt lot which is virtually unusable and unsafe. Improvements include an all season synthetic turf field, new hardscape paving and a seat wall. As a result of deferred maintenance and heavy use, the field is currently an unusable dirt lot. Community and stakeholders meetings were held over a three month period. A drainage study recommended the installation of a synthetic turf.

9. CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS:

A. Request the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission to Accept the Minor Conditional Use Permit Application (MCUP) for the Stonehurst Park Community Market Farm. Mark Hall presented the report for Item 9A. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission reviewed a request from staff to accept and recommend the Minor Conditional Use Permit application for approval by the Planning Commission. An 18,325 square foot area located inside the Stonehurst Park will be established as the Stonehurst Park Edible Schoolyard and Community Garden. The space will feature a teaching area, fruit tree guild a garden shed, composting and vermiculture area. The managing organization, All Ah We/Us entered an agreement with the Office of Parks and Recreation to operate and maintain edible schoolyard and community garden space. Irrigation for the garden will be provided by the Oakland Unified School District and the Office of Parks and Recreation.

Commissioner Miller reported that the Dog Park Committee held its third meeting on November 12. The committee hopes gather ideas from OPR's eight Community Focus Group meetings scheduled for November and December. The committee expects to wrap up their initial findings in January 2013.

Commissioner Belcher attended November 13th Advisory meeting at Carmen Flores. Center Director, Angelica Lopez initiated a vending program to discourage illegal vending in the park. The Oakland Parks Commission rated Jose De La Cruz Park as the dirtiest in the City of Oakland.

Commissioner Du Bois attended the opening of the Oakland Zoo Medical Center and the Montclair Advisory Council's first meeting on October 23rd. She reported that the community was very engaged and that a new council member is affiliated with Chase Bank and wants to support the community. The Council discussed the poor lighting at the front stairs and their slippery surface.

Commissioner Marshall attended the East Oakland Sports Center (EOSC)/Ira Jinkins meeting on October 19th. The committee discussed the poor lighting between Ira and EOSC and sited the vacant Head Start building as a public safety issue. Commissioner plans to meet with Arroyo later in the month.

Commissioner Kadera-Redmond reported that the Community Gardens staff will be revising its rules and regulations of participation. It was determined that more commitment is needed from the community and that there are translations issues.

Director Jones-Taylor will have the Community Gardening staff provide the Commission with an informational report.

Commissioner Ricards attended Bushrod Advisory Council meeting on November 13th.



SUMMARY

Mrs. Jane Freeman and Mrs. Norma Wynn contacted the City requesting approval to install a new bench in the Florentine Garden section of the Morcom Amphitheater of Roses to honor Bert Freeman and James Francis Wynn. The bench will be placed in the last remaining designated space in the Florentine Garden which is located in the upper exhibit area near the pathway leading to Oakland Avenue. The metal frame, wooden slat bench and plaques will reflect existing bench styles in the garden. The bench will be placed facing the interior of the garden in the bump out between existing McKee and Morgenstrom benches (see location on Exhibit A). Mrs. Freeman and Mrs. Wynn will procure the dedication plaques (2) and provide them to the Department of Public Works (PWA) for installation. PWA will router out a space in the bench's back and flush mount/recess the plaque. The plaque is epoxy glued and screwed into place.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no negative fiscal impact to the Office of Parks and Recreation. The donors will fund the \$740 cost of the installed bench through the Friends of Oakland Parks and Recreation in addition to providing support with maintenance of the plaque.

BACKGROUND

Both families live in Oakland, one for 12 years, the other for 33 years. The Freemans live adjacent to the Rose Garden and Bert often walked the garden paths. Both ladies think of the Morcom Rose Garden as a little jewel in the city and are glad and encouraged to see the improvements over the years. Jane and Norma are thankful for the opportunity to remember their husbands in such a beautiful and peaceful place.

The dedication plaques will read as follows:

In loving memory of Bert Freeman 1926 - 2008

In loving memory of James Francis Wynn 1921 - 2012


RECOMMENDATION

SUMMARY

The Office of Parks and Recreation has received a request from the East Bay Front Runners and Walkers, a 501c3 non profit organization, for permission to collect on-site registration fees and sell an event related item during the 5K and 10K Pride Run/Walk at Lakeside Park on Saturday, October 12, 2013. The event related item is a pair of socks bearing the club's initials. Proceeds raised from the event will be donated to several local non-profit organizations. A Post Event Report for 2012 is attached.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact on the Office of Parks and Recreation.

BACKGROUND

Since 2005, the East Bay Front Runners and Walkers (EBFR&W) have held a Pride Run/Walk around Lake Merritt to encourage healthy recreation. The Pride Run/Walk is timed, and prizes are awarded to the winners in various categories. The EBFR&W's request for permission to collect on-site registration fees came before the PRAC in 2011 and 2012. They were granted approval both years.

In 2012, 145 people registered for the Pride Run/Walk event. Out of the 145 people that registered, 31 people registered on-site and \$975.00 was collected. A total of \$3,455.00 was raised for the event and donated to the following non-profit organizations: Running for a Better Oakland, Alameda's Midway Shelter, Berkeley's Pacific Center and the Oakland East Bay Gay Men's Chorus.

In addition to the request to collect on-site registration fees in 2013, the EBFR&W is also asking permission to sell their organization's socks at a cost of \$7.00 per pair. All participants receive a pair of EBFR&W socks and simple refreshments. Several persons have asked to buy more socks at the event. The EBFR&W would like to offer the socks as a convenience to participants.

The EBFR&W is affiliated with Road Runners Club of America (RRCA), a nationwide organization that provides advice, support and liability insurance for recreational running club. Liability insurance for the Pride Run/Walks has been supplied through RRCA.

RECOMMENDATION

Re: Request from East Bay Front Runners and Walkers to Collect On-Site Registration Fees and Sell Limited Merchandise during the 5K/10K Pride Run/Walk at Lakeside Park on Saturday, October 12, 2013

Dear Commissioners:

East Bay Front Runners and Walkers is a group of lesbians, gay men, bisexuals, transgenders, and friends who enjoy exercising outdoors. The club holds a run/walk every Saturday morning at a scenic location in the East Bay, including Lake Merritt, the Emeryville-Berkeley shoreline, and Bay Farm Island. The Saturday morning run/walks are non-competitive and very informal; participants simply meet at the announced location and then run or walk together.

Since 2005, the club has held an annual Pride Run/Walk consisting of 5K and 10K loops around Lake Merritt to encourage healthy recreation, particularly among those who are interested in a competitive event. The Pride Run/Walk is timed, and prizes are awarded to the winners in various categories. All participants receive a pair of EBFR&W socks bearing the club's initials and simple refreshments (bagels, fruit, and juice). A few informational booths have been set up by a local chiropractor and a gym, but no goods are sold.

Net proceeds from the Pride Run/Walk event have been donated to several local nonprofit organizations, and we plan to continue doing this in future years. The club has endeavored to turn over all event proceeds, after expenses, to recipient organizations. (Ordinary club expenses are supported by annual membership dues and not by the Pride Run event.) The 2012 Pride Run/Walk event held by East Bay Front Runners and Walkers produced approximately \$3,700 to be donated to the following organizations:

- Running for a Better Oakland, an organization that encourages 5th-12th grade Oakland students to develop healthy lifestyles through running.
- Midway Shelter in Alameda, which provides a safe and supportive environment for women and children suffering from homelessness and domestic violence.
- Pacific Center in Berkeley, which provides professional counseling and advocacy to enhance the well-being and self-respect of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender individuals.
- Oakland East Bay Gay Men's Chorus, a 40 to 50 voice gay men's chorus that performs a wide variety of music each year in concert and in numerous church, community and outreach performances.

Recipient organizations in 2013 have not yet been determined.

Each year, the number of participants has increased. In 2012, 165 persons registered. Runners and walkers were encouraged to pre-register using the club's website (<u>www.eastbayfrontrunners.org</u>). As

planned, most participants in the 2012 event registered in advance. Same-day registration was \$25, and advance registration was \$20. The number of registrants and monies collected were as follows:

Pre-registered, prepaid:

124 (\$20 each, \$2,480 total)

Pre-registered, paid on-site:

10 (\$20 each, \$200 total)

Registered/paid on-site:

31 (\$25 each, \$775 total)

In 2013, East Bay Front Runners and Walkers hopes to expand the reach of its annual Pride Run, both in the number of participants and in the funds raised for donation to worthy organizations. To assist in meeting this goal, the club requests permission to accept registration fees on race day at the event in Lakeside Park on October 12, 2013. Pre-registration will continue to be encouraged, using the club's website. We plan to set a higher race-day registration fee than advance registration fee. As in 2012, we anticipate that most participants will pre-register, even if given a choice to register onsite, but having the ability to accept on-site registration enhances the event's appeal and increases the number of participants. We hope to reach a goal of approximately 200 registrants in 2013, with fees collected on-site to be no more than about \$1,000.

In 2013, no on-site donations will be solicited either for East Bay Front Runners and Walkers or for the recipient organizations. No sale of food items will take place. We do request permission to sell one merchandise item on-site. The EBFR&W club produces socks bearing the club's initials, and one pair of socks is given to each participant in the run/walk. We request permission to sell additional pairs of socks to any participants who might want them (several persons asked to buy more socks at the 2012 Pride Run/Walk). Socks would be sold approximately at cost (about \$7 per pair), not as a fund-raising measure but simply as a convenience to participants.

East Bay Front Runners and Walkers is a nonprofit organization with 501(c)(3) status and is affiliated with Road Runners Club of America (www.rrca.org), a nationwide organization that provides advice, support, and liability insurance for recreational running clubs. Liability insurance for East Bay Front Runners and Walkers' Pride Run/Walks is supplied through RRCA.

One proposed change, however, would be to seek approval for very limited sales of EBFR&W socks which have the club's initials on them. A pair of socks is provided free to each race participant, and a few runners have asked to purchase additional pairs at the Pride Run. We would like to be able to accommodate them by selling socks roughly at cost (about \$7.00 per pair).

List any problems, concerns, or, other comments about your satisfaction in the way the event turned out? (Attach additional sheets, if necessary):

The EBFR&W Pride Run committee was very satisfied with the way the event turned out. More participants than in previous years enjoyed a morning of healthy outdoor exercise, and approximately \$3,700.00 was raised for distribution to the event's beneficiaries, all nonprofit organizations: the youth group Running for a Better Oakland, Alameda's Midway Shelter, Berkeley's Pacific Center, and the Oakland East Bay Gay Men's Chorus.

One minor problem was that the path around Lake Merritt was quite crowded on October 13. There were apparently two or three events going on that involved runners or walkers circling the lake. Of course, many people out enjoying the park does not represent a problem in any way, but perhaps next year it would be possible for the EBFR&W Pride Run committee to check with the City in advance of the Pride Run to see what events are scheduled to take place at the same time and where they are planned. We would not propose to alter anyone's run or walk course, but we might send additional course monitors in advance to crowded parts of the lake in order to help direct our runners.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact on the Office of Parks and Recreation.

BACKGROUND

Since 2001, Faith Network has rallied community support in the form of time, talents and resources for urban public schools by matching underperforming schools with community partners committed to serving them. The Faith Network has about 350 volunteers who assist using their talents in a variety of ways and 56 diverse community partners. They serve 40 schools in low-income neighborhoods.

Faith Network came before the PRAC in 2011 and 2012 with the same request to collect registration fees and charitable donations. They were granted approval both years.

In 2012, 130 people registered for the Champions for Children Walk/Run event. Out of the 130 people that registered, 20 people registered on-site and \$500.00 was collected.


