The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission reviewed the staff report for Item 8A presented by Alicia Parker from the Planning and Building Department. The City's Planning and Building Department will launch <u>Plan Downtown</u>, a two year planning process to develop a community-driven vision for the future of Downtown. The project team will host a week-long pop-up open house and <u>design charrette</u> at 1544 Broadway, the future home of <u>SPUR</u> Oakland, from October 20 to 27. SPUR Oakland, from October 20 to 27. Drop by anytime between 9am and 6pm (8pm on Tuesday and Thursday). A charrette is a combination of on-location planning, design studio and town meetings and is the centerpiece of the public participation process and focuses broad community input over a short period of time through hands-on participation. The Friends of Sausal Creek (FOSC) proposes to create two naturally appearing and functioning ephemeral (vernal pond) wetland areas inside the FOSC Native Plant Nursery in Joaquin Miller Park. J. <u>RECOMMENDATION REPORT REGARDING FINAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT APPLICATION FOR SHORELINE PARK (BROOKLYN BASIN)</u>

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) reviewed the staff report for Item 8J presented by Catherine Payne from Bureau of Planning . The purpose of this report was to seek a recommendation from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) regarding a Final Development Permit (FDP) application for Shoreline Park. The PRAC previously reviewed a preliminary design for Shoreline Park at their regularly scheduled meeting on April 8, 2015. At this time, the applicant, Zarsion-OHP 1, LLC (ZOHP) has submitted revised plans and seeks approval of the FDP by the Planning Commission. As part of the review process, Bureau of Planning staff requests that the PRAC conduct design review and make a recommendation the Planning Commission. The proposed Final Development Permit is to construct Shoreline Park, including the demolition of a large portion of the 9th Avenue Terminal, as approved under the Preliminary Development Permit. The Applicant seeks the Shoreline Park FDP in compliance with the Brooklyn Basin project conditions of approval requiring delivery of the park improvements prior to delivery of the 550th dwelling unit for Phase I.

Shoreline Park is one of three new parks included in the Brooklyn Basin redesign project. The site for Shoreline Park sits on approximately 10 acres near the Oakland Estuary and 9th Avenue. Past uses of the site included retail, commercial and industrials facilities, container storage and the Ninth Avenue Terminal. Preservation of the southeastern section of the Ninth Street Terminal with approximately 90% of the facility slated for demolition is included in the approved design plans. General design elements and amenities include: open spaces for passive use and planned events; connecting pathways to other parts of the greater parkland; off street parking; access to the Bay Trail; public art; raised planted areas including drought resistant shrubs and trees.

A Power Point presentation and overview of the Shoreline Park Design Plan for the Brooklyn Basin was provided. Staff and the project applicant fielded questions for the Commission.

Public Comments:

The project site is vast and empty. This is the first major parks project in decades; it is important to make changes now and not after its completion. In its current state, the 9th Avenue Terminal serves as a wind break which will be lost after demolition. Designs should reflect shaded and wind break features as well as a launch site for boats, canoes and kayaks. Restrooms will be needed throughout the park; current plans only reflect inclusion near the site of proposed restaurant areas. Parks programming management is needed.

- Due to possible contamination and splintering, reuse of the 9th Avenue Terminal wood for decking is not advisable. A greater disbursement and variety of vegetation in needed in the design plans. The project developer should retain management of the park in perpetuity.
- More restrooms, parking and public transportation will be needed to accommodate large events. Human activity will disturb nearby wildlife and migrating birds habitat. Developer should work with the California Native Plant Society and California Fish and Game.

PRAC Comments:

Manning: Trash and cigarette pollution entering the estuary and bay are of great concern. Trash control measures are needed. Educational kiosks are also needed to inform the public regarding rising sea level issues. It was requested that the Planning Commission delay their vote and return the project back to PRAC for continued review and consideration.

DuBois: More of the 9th Street Terminal should be retained; additional restrooms and vegetation are needed throughout the project. PRAC comments should consolidate its comments in a "white paper" and forward to the Planning Commission. Troubled that PRAC is faced with the last opportunity to review and make comments - the process is moving too fast.

Rosenbloom: Would like PRAC members serve on any future Design Review subcommittee.

Shoreline Parks should serve both local and regional communities.

Kadera-Redmond: Access to the water is needed for all to enjoy. Developers were encouraged to consider public art; incorporating Manzanita trees to facilitate visibility and changeable way-finding signs should to accommodate programs and large events in the park. Also recommends committing the developer to park programming.

Corbin: Shoreline Park is an expansive open space – the starkness may keep potential visitors away. Recommends consideration be given to the roof top garden sustainable design concept by incorporating living wall structures and living sculptures created by using drought resistant plants. Living wall structures can be used as wind barriers.

Wu: Shoreline Park should appeal to all Oakland residents as a destination spot. Project depictions lack diversity and give the feeling of gentrification.

Chair Miller: The project design depicts an immense area. More public art is needed – recommends thought be given to the Uptown Temporary Art Park. Contemplate giving PRAC further non-discretionary review of the project.

Corbin: What constitutes substantial? Shoreline Park will be a new City park for the people of Oakland, but the PRAC has a very small role to play in how the project unfolds over the unforeseeable future.

Du Bois: Does not mean to delay or prevent the project from occurring, but wants to have more impact and feedback. The purpose for following up on the word "substantial" is to determine if it is properly used in this type of document.

Staff: the language regarding the term "substantial" comes the Planning Code of the Oakland Municipal Code.

Manning: Requests that follow commissioners support Recommendations A and B.

Marshall: Would like motion to reflect A yes or no vote on Recommendations A, B and C.

 - o Inclusive design, so that the park feels like a welcoming space for Oakland residents, of all income groups and cultural backgrounds;
 - o Green design, such as green walls and green roofs;
 - o Interpretive elements to address sea-level rise;
 - o Additional moveable furniture;
 - o Continuity of park programming;
 - O Provision of children's play areas (potentially within the development itself and not necessarily in the Shoreline Park);
 - o Universal water access;
 - Wayfinding signage

- A substantial increase in the amount of public art, potentially including art in the water;
- Adequate provision of restrooms;
- o Adequate shade devices;
- o More imaginative design and features; and
- Addressing public comments submitted to the PRAC following publication of the staff report; and

Request the Planning Commission to include PRAC representation on a DRC subcommittee to conduct further design review and reporting, should the project be approved with a DRC subcommittee.
