SUMMARY

Oakland Parks and Recreation received a request from Niantic, Inc. to host a mobile cash bar and food truck vendors at their Abaddon Oakland event at Lakeside Park (Bandstand) and Lakeside Park Garden Center on Saturday, December 12, 2015. 100% of the sales from the beer, wine and food will be retained by the vendors. This is Niantic, Inc. first year hosting their fundraising event at Lakeside Park Bandstand and Garden Center. Their Post Event Report will be submitted to Oakland Parks and Recreation after the event, provided approval is granted by the Commission.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is a positive fiscal impact for Oakland Parks and Recreation. Niantic, Inc. is paying all rental fees required to host their event at the Lakeside Park (Bandstand) and Lakeside Park Garden Center.

BACKGROUND

Niantic, Inc. builds mobile real-world experiences that foster fun, exploration, discovery and social interaction. Originally incubated within Google, Niantic was founded by John Hanke, who previously helmed the Google Geo team (including Google Maps and Google Earth) after his startup Keyhole was acquired by Google. The company's immersive real-world game *Ingress* has been downloaded more than 13 million times and is played in more than 200 countries and territories worldwide. For more information on Niantic, please visit www.nianticlabs.com.

The event is titled "Abaddon Oakland". Niantic, Inc. will arrive to Lake Merritt Park Bandstand at 8 am, for a registration packet pickup 9 am to noon, no cash is exchanged during this process at all, we have some brief announcements at 1pm, and then the 2500 Ingress Agents (players of the game Ingress) will spread out to walk through the city of Oakland to capture points of interest for their team using the Ingress app on their cell phone. Ingress Agents return to the venue, from 5 pm to 8 pm for a standing reception party at the bandstand area, where a speaker from Niantic Labs, using a microphone and speakers from the bandstand, reveals the scores of which team captured more of the city. Lighting for the Lake Merritt Bandstand area to be used would be arranged by Niantic Labs, with lighting provided by Event Magic. Attendees can purchase for cash beer or wine from Lucky13, a mobile cash bar offering beer. It is a standing reception with hightop tables, no chairs as the crowd will be mingling and socializing. There will be two Food Truck vendors arranged by Niantic, Inc. on site to provide food for attendees. All attendees leave the Lake Merritt Abaddon Oakland event by 8 pm.

Lucky13 Catering is the cash bar provider and will apply for necessary permits with the City of Oakland. Niantic, Inc. would like to have two mobile bar units (one with 16 taps, one with 4) and a cash bar setup inside the Garden Center (VIP's ONLY) and Mobile Cash Bar at Lakeside Park (Bandstand). 100% of the cash collected would be kept by the Cash bar provider, Lucky13 Catering.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission approve Niantic Inc. request to have a mobile cash bar and mobile food truck vendor's onsite collecting 100% of the sales from the beer, wine and food sold at their event at Lakeside Park (Bandstand) and Lakeside Park Garden Center on Saturday, December 12, 2015. The group is aware that additional permits are required provided their request is granted.





About our event: The event is titled "Abaddon Oakland" Dec. 12th. Niantic Labs will setup tables at Lake Merritt Park Bandstand at 8am, for a registration packet pickup 9am to noon (no cash is exchanged). Brief announcements at 12:30pm, and then the ~2500 Ingress attendees will depart and spread out to walk through the city of Oakland to capture points of interest using the Ingress app on their cell phone. At 4:30pm, all Ingress Agents return to the park for a standing reception party in the bandstand park area. Microphone and speakers from the bandstand, will be used by an MC to reveal the scores of the event. The standing reception will offer beer & wine cash sales, and have a few scattered high-top cocktail tables, and no chairs as the crowd will be mingling and socializing. Two Food trucks will offer food for sale for those attendees who cannot wait until end of event for a meal due to health and other reasons. Lake Merritt Park Garden Center will host a VIP area for approximately 300 guests during the event, where an in-game celebrity will be signing collectible items (no cash exchanged for this) and VIP guests can purchase beer & wine inside the Garden Center from an approved caterer who collects and keeps all cash paid for drinks. All attendees leave the Lake Merritt Park Abaddon Oakland event by 8pm. Approximately 1 hour for cleanup is needed after that.

Lighting for the Lake Merritt Bandstand and park area between the bandstand and Lake Merritt Park Garden Center would be arranged by Niantic Labs, with power generator and lighting provided by Event Magic.

Niantic Labs is requesting permission to have mobile cash bars (one with 16 taps, one with 4) on site in the park using Lucky13 Catering, or other park approved caterer, with the proper permits and licenses, to provide a beer & wine cash bar for attendees at the event, and to use approximately Two Food Trucks that have license/permits for Lake Merritt Park. Placement of a Children's Memorial Statue in Lakeside Park

SUMMARY

Oakland has had almost 200 minors die violently in the past 20 years. The majority have been killed by guns. Because of this appalling number our population is riddled with families mourning the loss of a beloved son or daughter, brother or sister, grandchild, niece, nephew or friend.

In 2010 the Alameda Board of Supervisors approved the creation of two identical sculptures, one for the City of Oakland and one for the City of Hayward, as part of Alameda County's Children's Memorial Program. The cities of Oakland and Hayward were selected for installation because they had lost over two-thirds of the over 400 children killed in Alameda County.

It is time for Oakland to accept this generous gift and to create a place to honor, remember and mourn the tragic loss of our young people.

FISCAL IMPACT

The statue is a gift to the City of Oakland from the Alameda County Board of Supervisors. The statue has been cast and finished. All materials for base and marble slabs where names will be engraved are purchased and located with the statue. Costs to move and install the statue have been paid. The only cost the City of Oakland must bear is the pouring of the cement slab base for the sculpture.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- Goals and objectives A memorial to remember those Oakland children lost to violence. To provide a central Oakland location to honor these youths. An official mourning spot versus the temporary street shrines that are currently the only public acknowledgement of the community's loss. To acknowledge the scourge of gun violence in Oakland.
- <u>Community members and groups served</u> Families and loved ones of victims, members of the public visiting Lakeside Park.
- <u>Location</u> In Lakeside Park, to the left of Fairyland, near the road that leads to the Band Stand, at the site where the porthole from the Battleship Carl Vinson stood for 50 years.
- Implementation plan (including time line) The goal is to have the statue in place by Friday, April 29, 2016, for the National Children's Memorial Day ceremony.

• <u>Plan for ongoing operation or maintenance</u> – The Children's Memorial Grove Steering Committee will be responsible for adding names of children lost to violence by the end of the following year.

BACKGROUND

Alameda County Supervisor Gail Steele, serving from 1992 to 2011, focused her tenure as supervisor on issues affecting our youth population. She established the Alameda County Children's Memorial in 1996. With the East Bay Regional Park District, Alameda County dedicated a children's memorial grove with the planting of young Oak trees to remember all Alameda County children who lost their lives to violence.

In April 2001, the United States Congress adopted the Children's Memorial flag and a resolution introduced by Congressman Pete Stark (D-Calif) dedicating the fourth Friday in April as "National Children's Memorial Day".

Urged to do more by victims' families unable to access the Memorial Grove, and funded by the Alameda County District Two Fiscal Management Reward allocation, Sup. Steele had two bronze sculptures (one for Oakland, one for Hayward) created as part of the Alameda County Children's Memorial Program. The first was installed at the Hayward City Hall Complex in 2014 and the second sculpture sits at Bras and Mattos Monument Co. in Hayward, awaiting installation at an Oakland location where people can visit and honor the dead and reflect on the horrible losses from violence in Oakland.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request to install the Alameda County Board of Supervisors' gift of one Children's Memorial statue in Lakeside Park.





THROUGHOUT AMERICA, TRAGIC ACTS OF VIOLENCE AGAINST CHILDREN ARE OCCURRING WITH INCREASING FREQUENCY AND SENSELESSNESS, DESTROYING INNOCENT LIVES AND DEVASTATING FAMILIES AND COMMUNITIES.

IN 1996, ALAMEDA COUNTY AND THE EAST BAY REGIONAL PARK DISTRICT DEDICATED A CHILDREN'S MEMORIAL GROVE WITH THE PLANTING OF YOUNG OAK TREES TO REMEMBER ALL ALAMEDA COUNTY CHILDREN WHO LOST THEIR LIVES TO VIOLENCE, SO THEY WILL NEVER BE FORGOTTEN.

IN APRIL 2001, U.S. CONGRESS ADOPTED THE CHILDREN'S MEMORIAL FLAG AND A RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY CONGRESSMAN PETE STARK (D-CA) DEDICATING THE FOURTH FRIDAY OF APRIL AS "NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MEMORIAL DAY". THE MEMORIAL FLAG, WHICH WAS DESIGNED BY LEAH PATTY, AGE 16 FROM SAN LEANDRO, HAS BEEN DISTRIBUTED NATIONWIDE BY THE CHILD WELFARE LEAGUE OF AMERICA.

THIS STATUE IS NOW DEDICATED TO ALL CHILDREN WHO DIE FROM MALTREATMENT AND VIOLENCE EACH YEAR SIGNALING OUR DETERMINATION TO END THIS NEEDLESS LOSS.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Approve and authorize the execution of Procurement Contract No. 7231 with Main Street Art, Inc. (Principal: Brian Streadbeck, President and Location: Alpine, Utah) and Dennis Smith, artist, for the creation of two sculptures, one for the City of Oakland and one for the City of Hayward, for the Alameda County Children's Memorial Program in the total amount of \$90,000. Further, it is requested that the Board waive the competitive bid process and waive the SLEB requirement.


DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

Former District 2 Supervisor Gail Steele, a long-time advocate for children, established the Alameda County Children's Memorial in 1995/96. Previously, there were two annual programs where parents, family, and friends publicly honor children who have died by violence. One was held at the Alameda County Administrator Plaza in the month of April – and the other was held in October at the Lake Chabot Regional Park – East Bay Regional Park District. For many years, a tree had been planted in memory of each child that had died by violence, however in recent years finding space for such trees to be planted has become challenging.

Over the years, the Alameda County Children's Memorial has been nationally recognized, including when the United States Congress officially adopted Alameda County Children's Memorial Flag and designating the last Friday in April as a national day of remembrance of all children who have died by violence. Another effort supported by Ms. Steele was a sculpture she funded through her fiscal management reward savings for the Social Services Agency's Eden Multi-Service Center in Hayward around 2001. At that time, Ms. Steele worked closely with the artist, Dennis Smith. Further, it's been Ms. Steele's long-term plan to have another sculpture to honor children who died by violence. Mr. Smith has been working with Ms. Steele on this project for the past year and the design for the life-size bronze sculpture of three children has been approved and is ready for construction. Two monuments and two sculptures will be produced using the same design.

On December 16, 2010 your Board approved (Item #14A, File #26826) then Supervisor Gail Steele's recommendation -- a \$90,000 allocation from District Two's Fiscal Management Reward allocation to fund the creation of two sculptures, one for the City of Oakland and one for the City of Hayward, as part of the Alameda County's Children's Memorial Program. The cities of Oakland and Hayward were selected for installation of

statues as they had lost two-thirds of the approximately 360 children who have died by violence in the last 15 years. A community advisory committee was created to work with this sculpture project with coordination with the County Administrator's Office.

See attached rendering. These three children who died by violence are Warren Hoffman, 3 years of age; Jenny Lin, 14 years; and Christopher Jones, 17 years old. This design was prepared with the full consent and input of the children's parents/families. Ms. Steele also has been in contact with the representatives of the City of Hayward and City of Oakland. The castings are estimated to be completed around June 20, 2012.

As District 2 Supervisor, I am also a very strong advocate for children and I am supportive of this effort. The County will be returning with agreements with the City of Hayward and the City of Oakland for the location, installation and maintenance of the sculpture in the respective city.

SELECTION CRITIERA

As stated above, Dennis Smith was the artist for the statue at the Eden-Multi-Services Center, Hayward in 2001 to honor children who died by violence. As part of Ms. Steele's long-term plan to have another statue in memory of these children, Mr. Smith has been working with Ms. Steele on this project for the past year. Dennis Smith was selected in part because he has achieved international recognition as a figurative sculptor, primarily for his sensitive and insightful portrayals of children. His works are in countless private collections and on public display in over 30 states and in eight countries abroad including installations at the U.S. embassies in London, Moscow, and Prague. The design for the life-size bronze sculpture of three children has been approved by the respective families and is ready for construction. The sculptures for the City of Hayward and City of Oakland continue to honor all the children who have died by violence in Alameda County. The Board is requested to waive the competitive bid process since this artist and his work has been an integral part of a long-term plan. Also, there is a request to waive the SLEB requirements. This artist is sculpting these two sculptures at his studio in Utah and will be personally transporting and installing his work. His artistic work is specialized and it would not be practical to subcontract his work to a local SLEB firm.

<u>FINANCING</u>: Funding for these sculptures has previously been allocated for FY 2011-2012 and there is no financial impact to the County associated with this action.

Thank you for your consideration and approval.

To: Members of the Oakland Parks and Recreation Advisory Board

I am writing to support the request for your Advisory Board to accept the Children's Memorial statue and approve the location at Lake Merritt for its installation.

Beginning with the death of Castro Valley child Jenny Lin in 1994, I became aware of the huge numbers of Alameda County children who were dying by violence. Since 1994 through my office as County Supervisor a community committee formed, and we began to keep track of all violent deaths of Alameda County children under the age of 18. As of today, over 400 children have died by violence in Alameda County alone. Half of these children lived in Oakland. The next largest number of children lived in Hayward. Most of these deaths were barely acknowledged in the press.

As you know, when parents lose children, especially to violence, their hearts become broken, never to mend. It is critical for the community to honor these children, and help families to feel they are not alone. Congress has set aside a special day in April to honor these children across the nation. The families and children of Oakland need your support to face this difficult issue.

In the beginning the East Bay Regional Park District helped us by creating a stone memorial circle in the park above Juvenile Hall. It is the most beautiful site, with oak trees planted year by year for each child; there are now over 200 trees. Several issues developed over the years. First, there is no more space for additional trees. Second, parents and families cannot drive up to the site, about a mile, without specific permission from the Park District. Many parents and families cannot reasonably walk that distance, so the site was and is inaccessible to many who need it most.

The committee developed the project of creating a statue to honor these children, which could be placed more accessibly. Our sculptor's models were three Alameda County children who died violently, two of whom lived in Oakland. They represent all children who have died and continue to die by violence.

The location of this statue in Oakland needs to be easily physically accessible. Hayward has placed its copy of this same statue behind Hayward City Hall, accessible by BART, AC Transit, and cars. There has been absolutely no harm to the statue, and people like it, whether they are involved with the specific issue or not. We want Oakland to have the same experience, and request that you accept this statue and approve the location at Lake Merritt.

SUMMARY

The applicant requests Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission approval of a Major Conditional Use Permit and Regular Design Review to construct a Mini Telecommunications Facility consisting of a ten foot (10') extension to an existing 64.3 foot Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) tower with six (6) antennas and a 646 square foot equipment area on the ground in a portion of Columbian Gardens Park owned by PG&E

FISCAL IMPACT

As this portion of Columbian Gardens Park is owned and maintained by Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E), Planning Staff believe there will be no short- or long-term fiscal impacts due to Verizon Wireless leasing and installing a Mini Telecommunications facility at the subject site.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

To construct a Mini Telecommunications Facility consisting of a ten foot (10') extension to an existing 64.3 foot Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) tower for a total height of 74.3 feet with six (6) antennas and a 646 square foot, fenced in equipment area on the ground between overhead power lines in a portion of Columbian Gardens Park owned by PG&E.

BACKGROUND

This type of application requires a Major Conditional Use Permit for a Mini Telecommunications facility in the OS Open Space, Neighborhood Park Zone (section 17.11.090 B and 17.128.060C) and Design Review (section 17.136.050B and 17.128.060B) with review and approval by the Planning Commission.

Limitations on Local Government Zoning Authority under the Telecommunications Act of 1996 Section 704 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (TCA) provides federal standards for the siting of "Personal Wireless Services Facilities." "Personal Wireless Services" include all commercial mobile services (including personal communications services (PCS), cellular radio mobile services, and paging); unlicensed wireless services; and common carrier wireless exchange access services. Under Section 704, local zoning authority over personal wireless services is preserved such that the FCC is prevented from preempting local land use decisions; however, local government zoning decisions are still restricted by several provisions of federal law.

Under Section 253 of the TCA, no state or local regulation or other legal requirement can prohibit or have the effect of prohibiting the ability of any entity to provide any interstate or intrastate telecommunications service.

Further, Section 704 of the TCA imposes limitations on what local and state governments can do. Section 704 prohibits any state and local government action which unreasonably discriminates among personal wireless providers. Local governments must ensure that its wireless ordinance does not contain requirements in the form of regulatory terms or fees which may have the "effect" of prohibiting the placement, construction, or modification of personal wireless services. Section 704 also preempts any local zoning regulation purporting to regulate the placement, construction and modification of personal wireless service facilities on the basis, either directly or indirectly, on the environmental effects of radio frequency emissions (RF) of such facilities, which otherwise comply with FCC standards in this regard. See, 47 U.S.C. 332(c)(7)(B)(iv) (1996). This means that local authorities may not regulate the siting or construction of personal wireless facilities based on RF standards that are more stringent than those promulgated by the FCC. Section 704 mandates that local governments act upon personal wireless service facility siting applications to place, construct, or modify a facility within a reasonable time. 47 U.S.C.332(c)(7)(B)(ii). See FCC Shot Clock ruling setting forth "reasonable time" standards for applications deemed complete.

Section 704 also mandates that the FCC provide technical support to local governments in order to encourage them to make property, rights-of-way, and easements under their jurisdiction available for the placement of new spectrum-based telecommunications services. This proceeding is currently at the comment stage.

RECOMMENDATION

The Bureau of Planning recommends the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission recommend approval of the proposed Major Conditional Use Permit and Design Review to construct a Mini Telecommunications Facility consisting of a ten foot (10') extension to an existing 64.3 foot Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) tower for a total height of 74.3 feet with six (6) antennas and a 646 square foot, fenced in equipment area on the ground between overhead power lines in a portion of Columbian Gardens Park owned by PG&E. The proposed project will result in better telecommunications for residents living in the neighborhood surrounding the park and for those traveling along the 880 Freeway.





ANTENNA LAYOUT PLAN


