Oakland Parks & Recreation received a request from Lee Corrigan, President of Corrigan Sports Enterprises Inc. and Oakland Running Festival, for permission to serve and sell alcoholic beverages (Beer & Wine), food and accept donations on-site at the Oakland Running Festival Marathon to be held at Eastshore Park on Sunday, April 2, 2017. Funds collected will benefit City and local charities. A portion of the alcohol beverage sales will go to the Fire Department's Random Acts Charity. Approval from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission is required per O.M.C. Section 12.64.080.

#### 7. NEW BUSINESS

A. REQUEST FOR APPROVAL FROM THE OAK KNOLL NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION (OKNIA) TO HAVE A GROVE OF OAKS IN THE GLENN W. DANIEL/KING ESTATE OPEN SPACE PARK BE NAMED IN MEMORY OF CLYDE GRIMES SR. WITH AN INSTALLED MOSAIC PLAQUE The Office of Parks & Recreation has received a request from the Oak Knoll Neighborhood Improvement Association (OKNIA). They are proposing a grove of oaks in the Glenn W. Daniel/King Estate Open Space Park be named in memory of Clyde Grimes Sr., with an installed tile mosaic plaque. (Exhibit A) After WWII, he attended UC Berkeley, becoming a successful architect, establishing a firm in Los Angeles that executed residential and commercial designs for over twenty-two years. He served in the civic arena as the State of California Deputy Architect then served as an architect for the City of Oakland until his retirement in 1991. Mr. Clyde Grimes was a member of the renowned Tuskegee Airman and served in the intelligence division of the 477 Bombardment group until his discharge at the end of WWII. He and his wife of more than 60 years were among those present in March 2007, when President George W. Bush presented the Tuskegee Airmen with the Congressional Gold Medal at the United States Capital.

### B. REQUEST TO ALLOW PRF BBQ ORGANIZERS TO COLLECT ADMISSION FEES AT THE ANNUAL PRF BBQ WEST AND FOR VENDORS TO COLLECT ONSITE FUNDS AT MOSSWOOD PARK ON APRIL 22-23, 2017.

Parks and Recreation Advisory Council approval is required in order for PRF BBQ to solicit fees for vendors to sell merchandise at a City of Oakland park, in accordance with Oakland Municipal Code Section 12.64.080. This proposal is for the PRF BBQ West, an annual event in Oakland since 2014. The event attracts approximately 200 attendees from Oakland and the Bay Area and features local musicians in a family friendly environment, with proceeds donated to a worthy cause. This year, proceeds will be donated to the Rebuild Mosswood fund. PRF BBQ is requesting the approval of participating vendors' onsite money collection for merchandise sold and approval to collect admission fees onsite which will help cover the cost of musicians, equipment, marketing, staffing, and facility usage.

C. REQUEST APPROVAL TO ALLOW DOPEONLY (DO) PERMISSION TO COLLECT ONSITE ENTRY FEES, SALES OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, SALES OF FOOD AND T-SHIRT VENDORS AT THE 2<sup>ND</sup> COOL WATER EVENT HELD AT JACK LONDON AQUATIC CENTER ON SATURDAY, MAY 27, 2017.

Oakland Parks & Recreation received a request from DopeOnly (DO), a brand management and marketing firm, requesting to collect funds at a community based event known as Cool Water. This event was created as a social gathering to find synergy within the City of Oakland and has become a grand melting pot of people from all walks of life. Five percent of the funds collected from Cool Water will go to Alameda County Network of Mental Health Clients, a IRC 501(c)(3) non-profit organization whose mission is to improve the quality of life of mental health clients within Alameda County. Approval from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission is required per O.M.C. section 12.64.080.

#### **SUMMARY**

Oakland Parks & Recreation received a request from Lee Corrigan, President of Corrigan Sports Enterprises Inc. and Oakland Running Festival, for permission to serve and sell alcoholic beverages (Beer & Wine), food and accept donations on-site at the Oakland Running Festival Marathon to be held at Eastshore Park on Sunday, April 2, 2017. Funds collected will benefit City and local charities. A portion of the alcohol beverage sales will go to the Fire Department's Random Acts Charity. Approval from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission is required per O.M.C. Section 12.64.080.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Corrigan Sports Enterprises Inc. is paying all rental fees associated with the event estimated at \$3,735.00.

#### PROJECT / PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This is the eighth year of the Oakland Running Festival Marathon in the City of Oakland. The Oakland Running Festival Marathon is a five race event which attracts people from all over the world to run through the streets of Oakland. In six years, the race has generated almost \$15 million for the City and raised \$1,800,000 for local charities such as Running for a Better Oakland, Team in Training, Squash Drive, Calico and Asian Health Services.

#### BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Corrigan Sports Enterprises Inc. was established 16 years ago with the idea to create memorable experiences through sporting events. Corrigan Sports Enterprises, Inc. has grown into a full service sports marketing firm, hosting events all over the USA and establishing a local office in Oakland, California.

Since 2010 and 2012 – 2016, the Commission has granted the event organizers permission to host the Oakland Running Festival which has proven to be well planned, extremely successful and well received by the community. Registration fees are paid and collected in advance, and range from \$15 to \$260. There are approximately 10,000 registered participants.

The Oakland Running Festival is a citywide event and is jointly supported by the City Council Office, OPD Special Events Unit, City Administrator's Marketing Department and the Oakland Parks & Recreation.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request from Corrigan Sports Enterprises to accept donations and sell alcoholic beverages and food, at Oakland Running Festival at Eastshore Park on Sunday, April 2, 2017.

Lee Corrigan, President of the Oakland Running Festival, is aware that additional permits are required provided the request is granted.



WITH AN INSTALLED MOSAIC PLAQUE

**SUMMARY** 

The Office of Parks & Recreation has received a request from the Oak Knoll Neighborhood Improvement Association (OKNIA). They are proposing a grove of oaks in the Glenn W. Daniel/King Estate Open Space Park be named in memory of Clyde Grimes Sr., with an installed tile mosaic plaque. (Exhibit A) After WWII, he attended UC Berkeley, becoming a successful architect, establishing a firm in Los Angeles that executed residential and commercial designs for over twenty-two years. He served in the civic arena as the State of California Deputy Architect then served as an architect for the City of Oakland until his retirement in 1991. Mr. Clyde Grimes was a member of the renowned Tuskegee Airman and served in the intelligence division of the 477 Bombardment group until his discharge at the end of WWII. He and his wife of more than 60 years were among those present in March 2007, when President George W. Bush presented the Tuskegee Airmen with the Congressional Gold Medal at the United States Capital.

The mosaic plaque is designed by his wife, Minnie, a noted Bay Area painter and created by sculptor Phillip Dow. Mr. Dow based the stone work on Stan Dobson's 'Stone Steps Markers' placed on the Dimond Canyon Trail, approved by PRAC on May 22, 2015. The plaque will read as follows: Clyde Grimes Sr., AIA Memorial Grove.

FISCAL IMPACT

There will be no fiscal impact on the Office of Parks & Recreation. The costs of materials and installation will be donated by OKNIA. The installation will be completed by volunteers recruited from the community by OKNIA. Oakland Public Works will oversee the placement of the plaque.

**BACKGROUND** 

Clyde and Minnie Grimes moved into the Oak Knoll area in 1985, where both became activist for the community. They spearheaded the process of establishing the Glen W. Daniel/King Estate Open Space Park. Once the land was secured by the City of Oakland, Clyde recruited a UC Berkeley landscaper to create a master plan which was gifted to the City of Oakland and approved by the City Council in 1998. Mr Grimes helped to establish the OKNIA, a 501(c)(3), which has been a great supporter and caretaker of this open space treasure. The trails are home to soaring birds that make you feel as though you can touch their wings and a perfect view of the bay area in the midst of East Oakland. Members continue to re-established native plants in

blighted areas as well as maintaining the trails by working with OPRYD staff on addressing safety issues.

Clyde will be remembered for his grace and thoughtfulness, his tireless effort toward making our community a better place to live and his dedication to preserving open spaces for wildlife and the public to enjoy. The maintenance of this area would not have happened without the perseverance and activism of Mr. Clyde Grimes Sr. (Exhibit A).

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request from the Oak Knoll Neighborhood Improvement Association (OKNIA) to have a grove of oaks in the Glen W Daniel/King Estate Open Space Park be named in memory of Clyde Grimes Sr. with an installed mosaic plaque

He and his wife of more than 60 years, Minnie, were among those present in March, 2007, when President George W. Bush presented the Tuskegee Airmen with the Congressional Gold Medal during a ceremony in the Rotunda of the United States Capitol.


After the war, Clyde attended UC Berkeley and became a successful architect, establishing a firm in Los Angeles that executed residential and commercial designs for over twenty-two years. He then applied his skills in the civic arena, becoming a California deputy state architect. Clyde served as an architect for the City of Oakland until his retirement in 1991.

Clyde and Minnie moved to our neighborhood in 1985, and both became activists for our community. Clyde was president of the Oak Knoll Neighborhood Improvement Association in the early 1990s and shepherded the process of establishing the Glenn W. Daniel/King Estate Open Space Park. Once the land was secured by the City of Oakland, Clyde recruited the UC Berkeley Landscape Architecture Department to create a master plan for the park. The park master plan, gifted to the city, was approved by the City Council in 1998.

Clyde will be remembered for his grace, thoughtfulness, and tireless efforts toward making our community a better place to live.

The proposal would entail placing an 18" diameter mosaic plaque, at grade, adjacent to a hiking trail that climbs through the oak grove in the northeast corner of the open space park, near the Greenly fire gate (see drawing). The mosaic will contain the words "Clyde Grimes Sr., AIA, Memorial Grove". The

design of the plaque will be developed by Minnie Grimes, an Oakland painter, and Philip Dow, an Oakland sculptor.



The installation will be similar to the mosaic trail markers located along the Dimond Park/Sausal Creek trails. The costs of materials and installation will be donated by the OKNIA board of directors.




Broken tile assembled in mosaic pattern.

VENDORS TO COLLECT ONSITE FUNDS AT MOSSWOOD PARK ON

APRIL 22-23, 2017.

#### **SUMMARY**

Parks and Recreation Advisory Council approval is required in order for PRF BBQ to solicit fees for vendors to sell merchandise at a City of Oakland park, in accordance with Oakland Municipal Code Section 12.64.080. This proposal is for the PRF BBQ West, an annual event in Oakland since 2014. The event attracts approximately 200 attendees from Oakland and the Bay Area and features local musicians in a family friendly environment, with proceeds donated to a worthy cause. This year, proceeds will be donated to the Rebuild Mosswood fund. PRF BBQ is requesting the approval of participating vendors' onsite money collection for merchandise sold and approval to collect admission fees onsite which will help cover the cost of musicians, equipment, marketing, staffing, and facility usage.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Mosswood will provide 2 staff to help monitor this event for a total fiscal impact of approximately \$750. Mosswood will charge approximately \$3100 for usage of the park for this event. The revenues will be deposited to the Fund 1820 – OPR Self-Sustaining fund, which supports on-going programs, events and activities.

#### PROJECT / PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

PRF BBQ West is a low cost event that features local musicians and features a community potluck amongst concert attendees. This year, proceeds from the event will be donated to Mosswood Recreation Center to help rebuild the community facility. Performances, which feature local performing artists, are scheduled to take place at the Mosswood Amphitheater located at Mosswood Park, 3612 Webster Street, Oakland, between the hours of 12:00pm and 8:00pm on Saturday, April 22 and Sunday April 23. Setup for this event will begin at 10:00am each day and clean-up will concur at 9:00pm each night.

#### BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

PRF BBQ West began in 2014 in a smaller venue in Oakland. In 2016, the event moved to Mosswood Park Amphitheater. This will be the second year the event will be at Mosswood Park. However, this is the first time that PRF BBQ organizers have requested to collect admission fees and sell merchandise onsite. The event is an opportunity for music lovers of all ages to come together to hear new music and share a meal in a family friendly environment at a beautiful local park.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Park and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request for the PRF BBQ to collect admission fees onsite and for artists to collect fees for merchandise sold at the PRF BBQ West at Mosswood Park on April 22 and 23, 2017. Providing that this event meets the requirements of OPD and outstanding documents and payments have been submitted to OPR.

Staff recommends that PRF BBQ West provide at least 3 portable restrooms, one of which is ADA accessible, and 2 handwashing stations, one of which is ADA accessible.

Below is a list of outstanding requirements needed to complete OPR paperwork. Information to OPR should be submitted no later than August 4, by 5pm in order to complete facility permit.

#### **OPR Required Documents:**

- 1. Oakland Police Department Special Events Permit
- 2. Certificate of Insurance
- 3. Proof of Trash Bin/Recycling Bins
- 4. Proof of (2) reserved Portable Restrooms and handwashing stations; 1 Portable restroom must be ADA Accessible.

#### Proposal for PRF BBQ West 2017 Saturday, April 22-23rd, 2017

Dear Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission

The PRF BBQ West is an annual event that started in Oakland in 2014. Supporting a community of music lovers and gear nerds, it grew from an internet forum into a real life meeting place with live music, food, laughter and charitable giving to worthy causes.

The PRF BBQ West is located in Oakland, California and was founded by longtime Oakland resident Conan Newton who is a Network Engineer and independent performing arts professional.

Although the PRF BBQ is not a registered non-profit, thousands of dollars have been raised for causes such as the victims of the Ghost Ship fire, a community member's medical bills after beating cancer, and other such charitable ventures. Its goal is to leave the world a better place than it was when it came in. After costs are met, the proceeds of each year are donated to a worthy charity. In this case, we choose our friends at the Mosswood Recreation Center as the beneficiary.

There is a unique appeal to hearing music in an outside setting with your friends, in a safe and legal environment. This is the kind of feeling the PRF BBQ West drives for, providing an opportunity for young children to see their mothers and fathers perform, and for an audience of all ages to enjoy the art of local bands in the community.

It will be held Saturday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23rd, 2017 at Mosswood Park in Oakland. The event will be \$25 for a two-day pass, or \$15 per day and is open to the public.

- a. The event sponsor, PRF BBQ, is requesting permission from the park to collect admission fees from attendees by cash as well as card, beginning March 1<sup>st</sup> to April, 22nd, 2017, to defray festival expenses.
- b. We are requesting permission from the park to allow the following to collect money at the site:
- 1. Event volunteer staff, who will collect admissions fees for the event itself, to help defray the costs of putting on the event, with additional proceeds going towards the reconstruction of Mosswood Park facilities damaged in the fire.

- 2. Event merchandise, including posters, t-shirts, stickers and buttons, again to help defray the costs of putting on the event, with additional proceeds going towards the reconstruction of Mosswood Park facilities damaged in the fire.
- 3. Merchandise from the performing local bands to sell to interested attendees.
- c. We are requesting permission from the park to:
- 1. Allow alcohol to be consumed in a designated and fenced off area, with appropriate ID being checked at the entrance area of the event and the drinking area.
- 2. Rope off the amphitheater to allow for an area for wrist banded admission. While we do not have interest in turning away members of the community, bike riders and homeless people can become very disruptive.
- 3. Use picnic tables and BBQ pits for attendees own dishes, and foods for potluck.

#### The event will feature:

- 1) Live music by over 22 local bay area bands!
- 2) A raffle for various boutique music equipment, with proceeds going to Mosswood Park.
- 3) Potluck style BBQ for all attendees. Although food will not be sold, food will be onsite and will be disposed of properly.
- 4) Donation and information table for local charities
- 5) A beer garden area for qualifying attendees 21+ to share an adult beverage in a sectioned off area, legally and safely.

The Mosswood Park days of the PRF BBQ West will be augmented by activities/events the day before at other local venues.

#### **SUMMARY**

Oakland Parks & Recreation received a request from DopeOnly (DO), a brand management and marketing firm, requesting to collect funds at a community based event known as Cool Water. This event was created as a social gathering to find synergy within the City of Oakland and has become a grand melting pot of people from all walks of life. Five percent of the funds collected from Cool Water will go to Alameda County Network of Mental Health Clients, a IRC 501(c)(3) non-profit organization whose mission is to improve the quality of life of mental health clients within Alameda County. Approval from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission is required per O.M.C. section 12.64.080.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

DopeOnly (DO) is paying all rental fees associated with the event estimated at \$3147.50.

#### PROJECT / PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Cool Water is a social gathering which occurs several times a year. While the target demographic are like-minded professionals between the ages of 25 to 50, all are welcome to attend and participate in the organization's efforts to provide clothing to vulnerable community members through the Hoodies for the Homeless Initiative.

The following is a list of fees to be collected onsite:

• Entry Fee: \$20.00 per person

• Alcoholic Beverage Sales: \$8.00-\$15.00 per drink

• Food Sales: \$6.00- \$15.00 per item

• T-shirt and Sweatshirt Sales: \$10.00-\$40.00 per item

Five percent of the funds collected from Cool Water will go to The Alameda County Network of Mental Health Clients will receive 5% of the funds collected. Small business will also benefit via Cool Water vendor ship. Event organizers anticipate an estimated attendance of 1000.

#### BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

DopeOnly (DO) is a community based Brand Management/Marketing firm which was established in 2012. The mission is to create space where fresh occurrences happen continually through conversation, produce sales (t-shirts/sweatshirts), hosting events and marketing products that support the Oakland Community.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request from DopeOnly (DO) to collect entry fees, sell alcoholic beverages, and host food/t-shirt vendors on site at the Cool Water Event held at Jack London Aquatic Center on Saturday, May 27, 2017.

We are formally requesting to collect funds at Jack London Aquatic Center

The funds collected will be as follows:
Entry Fee \$20.00
Alcohol beverage sales ranging from \$8.00-\$15.00 per drink
Sales to food vendors ranging from \$6.00 - \$15.00
T-Shirt/Sweat shirt sales ranging from \$10.00 - \$40.00

Funds collected will support small businesses at Cool Water via vendorship. A wide array of food types and art vendors have come to gather at Cool Water, highlighting the flow of commerce. 5% of the funds collected from the Cool Water event will also go to the Alameda County Network of mental health clients. However, each and every small business there must have the same feel for customer service that

we have, which is there is nothing more important, period. It is our hope to catapult a standard of business where high level products and high level customer service are common place.

WOODMINSTER AMPHITHEATER PHASE 2 ADA IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

#### **SUMMARY**

PRAC endorsement is requested for the Conditional Use Permit for the Woodminster Amphitheater Phase 2 ADA Improvements Project. The project involves accessibility upgrades to the lower amphitheater. Wheelchair accessible seats will be added to the lower box seating, and the amphitheater stage will be made wheelchair accessible. An accessible picnic table/area will be added just outside of the lower amphitheater main entryway. ADA parking spaces are being added at the lower parking lot with compliant path of travel. Lastly, as an option, a permanent exterior ADA accessible restroom facility will be constructed if feasible within the project budget. See attached 30% design drawings dated January 4, 2017.

Phase 1 of the Woodminster Amphitheater project involving accessibility improvements to the upper amphitheater was completed in 2015. The Phase 2 construction project is anticipated to begin in the fall of 2017 and completed by April 2018. Woodminster Amphitheater will be closed from public during construction.

Woodminster Amphitheater is located at 3300 Joaquin Miller Road in Joaquin Miller Park. The amphitheater is a designated local landmark constructed in the late 1930's as a Works Progress Administration (WPA) project. It is a city-owned facility that is leased to the Producers Associates for the annual Woodminster Summer Musicals and a number of live seasonal concerts are hosted at the facility by the Oakland Parks & Recreation Department. The parcel is zoned Open Space – Regional-Serving Park (OS-RSP).

The Project is funded through the City's General Purpose Fund and Woodminster Trust revenues from the ticket sales.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The Project is funded by the General Purpose Fund and Woodminster Trust funds approved for accessibility improvements at the amphitheater. The Staff anticipates no fiscal impact from the proposal.

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

As shown on the attached 30% Design Plans, the ADA improvements will consist of following features:

- Four (4) ADA parking spaces at the lower theater parking lot
- Four (4) wheelchair seats and four (4) companion seats at the lower box seating of the amphitheater;
- Improved access to the lower amphitheater main entry;
- Wheelchair access to the stage:
- Accessible picnic table/area outside the lower amphitheater;

- A permanent ADA restroom facility outside the lower amphitheater (as an option pending project budget);
- ADA compliant path of travel from parking spaces to picnic table/area, restroom, and wheelchair seating;
- Three trees are being proposed to be removed (separate tree removal permit will be submitted for approval prior any construction).

#### **BACKGROUND**

Per the Oakland City Council Resolution No. 85195 C.M.S. dated October 7, 2014, to compromise and settle a lawsuit filed with the City for denial of legally compliant disabled access at Woodminster Amphitheater, the main goal of the Woodminster Amphitheater Phase 2 ADA Improvements project is to perform and fulfill the injunction relief pursuant to the settlement agreement of the parties involved to address specific ADA non-compliance issues at the facility. The corrective measures need to be completed by December 31, 2018, per the settlement agreement. The Producer Associates need the amphitheater for stage setup and rehearsals for their 2018 performance season by May 2018. Therefore, the construction project needs to be completed before May.

Currently, temporary portable accessible restrooms are rented and placed outside the main Woodminster lower amphitheater entryway during performances and events to accommodate ADA requirements. If the permanent accessible restroom facility proposed in this project is not feasible to construct within the project budget, temporary portable facilities will continue to be placed at the lower amphitheater.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission endorse and recommend approval of the Conditional Use Permit for Woodminster Amphitheater Phase 2 ADA Improvements for the design components mentioned herein. The improvements are needed to upgrade the amphitheater to meet ADA compliance requirements.
