Oakland Police Commission Supplementary Questions - Onyinye Alheri

Please describe any life work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare you to contribute to the work of the Commission.

I am a volunteer community health worker who provides several services including emergency response, birth attendance, basic first aid, and mental health/de-escalation. I have been doing this for the past three and a half years. I also work full time as an outreach worker and counselor for a non-profit agency in San Francisco.

I currently serve as a member of several community organizations in the Bay Area including Causa Justa::Just Cause, East Oakland Building Healthy Communities, HOPE Collaborative, People's Community Medics and most recently the Oakland Tenants Union. Along with this, I have just completed the Boards and Commissions Leadership Institute, a 6-month intensive training provided by Urban Habitat. In that space my colleagues and I learned about many facets of city planning, including the history of development and land use in the Bay Area, economic and workforce development & labor, transportation justice, affordable housing and health equity. Additionally we were encouraged to identify what boards most aligned with our interests and attend their meetings. This is how I came to discover the now defunct Citizens Police Review Board. Since February I have attended those meetings to observe what the board does and how it functions. Thanks to the training I received, I am now very familiar with basic parliamentary procedure and Robert's/Rosenberg's Rules. This, in addition to my connection with individuals and community groups, makes me well versed in and connected to the needs of Oakland's people.

Please describe your contacts or experiences with the Oakland Police Department.

I have no contacts within the Oakland Police Department at this point in time. My experiences with the OPD center around requests for their public services. I live in an area where crime is above average and have had to call the police on a few occasions. On each occasion I have been placed on hold for over 30 mins and for half of those calls no officer ever arrived despite the need for their presence. Additionally, I once had the unfortunate experience of witnessing a roommate experience physical harm at the hands of OPD simply because she was running down the street during a public event. I bring this up not to enflame or add strife to already tense relations between our citizens and our police. I do mention this because I have experienced and witnessed the shortcomings of a department composed of earnest, caring and extremely hardworking individuals. I am committed to the safety of my community and would like to become more intimately involved in a process that allows for community oversight and assurance of accountability for denizens, officers and our city government.

I work with homeless and unstably housed youth in San Francisco. A good portion of them have been charged and convicted of crimes of various classifications. However an equal portion of our clients have been victims of crimes of various classifications. My main role is that of a counselor, providing mental health counseling and assisting clients in accessing resources that lead to their employment, housing and self sufficiency. This is done regardless of whether our clients committed crimes or were victims of them.

Question 1: Please describe any life work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare you to contribute to the work of the commission:

I have been a resident of Oakland for the past 10 years, and currently am self-employed, operating a private psychotherapy and consultation practice located in Oakland. In 2014, I retired after serving 17 years as an employee of Sonoma County, working most of those years as a Court Investigator for Child Protective Services, as well as preparing evaluations for the Probate, Family and Juvenile Probation Courts. In this capacity, I was trained in investigative and evaluative protocols that allowed me to make unbiased and impartial decisions and recommendations based on review of available information, including first person interviews, law enforcement reports, and other collateral contacts. I was also trained in Child Forensic Interviewing at the advanced level, and used this skill set to interview children and adults with developmental disabilities who were victims of crime. I worked in both Sonoma and Contra Costa Counties as a forensic interview specialist, for total of five years, serving on multidisciplinary teams which included district attorneys, detectives, child protective services workers and victim advocates. After retiring from county work in 2014, I worked for two years as the Foster Family Agency program supervisor at Youth Homes, Inc. in Contra Costa County. In this position, I was responsible for hiring and supervising 4 employees, completing performance reviews, and managing day to day operations of the program, including monitoring program compliance with State policies and procedures and program budget reconciliation.

In addition to being a licensed clinical social worker, I hold a Master's degree in Sociology, which has allowed me to teach Sociology at a number of Colleges, since 1993, including: Santa Rosa Junior College (where I remain currently employed, part-time), Diablo Valley College, Marin Community College and Yuba College. My courses include instruction on social institutions, including the legal system, as well as examinations of institutional racism and the way it impacts and/or impairs the functioning of social institutions.

I possess other skill sets, developed through work and volunteer positions, which would be valuable to the Commission should I be selected to serve. While living in Davis, California, I served on the Human Rights Commission, interacting with the public, holding public hearings, investigating complaints, and assisting with preparation of the annual report. I also staffed the Child Death Review Committee in Alameda County in 1994 & 1995, collaborating and working in a multi-disciplinary setting, and preparing the annual report for the Board of Supervisors. I have worked in a technical writing capacity (both paid and volunteer), including preparing state mandated evaluations of legislation and recently, preparing a section of the Santa Rosa Junior College accreditation report, addressing student services available to low-income students, veterans and former foster youth. For many years, I volunteered supervising master's levels interns enrolled at UC Berkeley, San Francisco State and Sacramento State. In this capacity, I provided employment and clinical training, as well as conducting written performance reviews and recommendations.

In conclusion, I feel that my work and volunteer experience would make me uniquely qualified to serve on the Police Commission. As a long-time Oakland resident, I am deeply committed to civic responsibility and improving our community. As I am semi-retired, I have time to serve in this capacity.

Question 2: Please describe your contacts or experiences with the Oakland Police Department:

As an Oakland resident, living in the Oakmore Neighborhood, I have had very limited contact with OPD, outside of regularly attending neighborhood briefings conducted by our Neighborhood Crime Prevention Council officer, in order to remain informed about local issues and concerns. I have, of course, had officers respond to take reports of property crimes and I have filed reports using the on-line system regarding vehicle break-ins (more than once). In my neighborhood, police presence is limited, which has resulted in our neighborhood hiring, for the past 4 years, private security patrol. I have mixed feelings about this solution, but we have definitively noted a decrease in petty crimes since instituting private patrol.

Only once have I had a negative interaction with OPD. Many years ago, when I was home alone, a male intruder was in my fenced back yard, attempting entry into my home in the early morning hours. When I called dispatch, I was informed that there was no available officer to respond, and that trespassing reports did not mandate a priority response. While the intruder was not successful and ultimately left my property when my dog began barking, I was underwhelmed by the response of OPD to what could have been a serious situation. However, I do understand, in retrospect, how difficult decisions must be made in assigning priority to requests for assistance.

I respectfully submit my name for consideration to serve on the reformed Oakland Police Commission. I believe that I have a unique combination of professional and personal experience that make me a highly qualified candidate. I have lived in Oakland for 13 years and I currently live in the Santa Fe neighborhood, District 1, Beat 10Y, with my husband, and two children. In addition to my professional experience summarized briefly below, I serve as Santa Fe Community Association & Neighbors, Board Member At Large and Public Safety Co-Chair. Serving as a member of the Police Commission is a natural next step in my service to Oakland as a community steward demanding transparency and accountability in the Oakland Police Department.

I have over 16 years of experience working within and closely with local and state governments to provide services and improve outcomes for individuals and families impacted by criminal justice systems. I currently serve as Director of Policy at the Office of San Francisco District Attorney George Gascón, a leadership role advancing policy on behalf of the San Francisco District Attorney's Office. I serve as office policy liaison for issues related to sentencing, police accountability and transparency, pre-trial diversion, fines and fees, human trafficking, victim services, restorative justice, and implementation of criminal justice reforms such as Propositions 47 and 57. I transitioned to the District Attorney's Office after serving as the Senior Planner and Policy Analyst for the Violence Prevention and Intervention Unit at San Francisco's Department of Children Youth and Their Families. Prior to my government work, I served as the Children and Family Programs Manager for Centerforce, a non-profit working with prisoners, their families and persons recently released from jails and prisons in Northern and Central California. In this role I attend Neighborhood Crime Prevention Council Meetings (now known as Neighborhood Council), where I have had regular interaction with Beat 10Y Community Resource Officer (CRO) Michael Ransom and Neighborhood Services Coordinator Felicia Verdin.

In January 2017 members of Beat 10Y elected new leadership to our NCPC with Max Kurtz-Cadji now serving as council Chair. Max brings a advanced training in restorative justice and it has been positive to see how OPD and Housing Authority representatives actively engage in his restorative justice facilitation, ultimately seeking non law enforcement intervention to solve community issues.

My brother Thomas S. Regan currently serves as a Sargent in the Wethersfield Police Department, located in Wethersfield, CT. Sgt. Regan is in his 22nd year with WPD. He completed police academy in 1995, my junior year of high school. He has served as a patrol officer, DARE Officer, Capitol Area SWAT Team member, Juvenile Detective and now Sargent.

I was inspired to study criminal justice in undergrad thanks to my brother, my Uncle a former judge and father former legal officer in the Navy. Growing up with family stories of criminal justice around my kitchen table has lead me to the complex understanding of the stress and burden placed on those who choose to serve the community as law enforcement and the family who care for them. I've had both successful and unsuccessful experiences in attempting to do this with police officers. I also ran a national organization for 5 years (after my time in OUSD) that focused on systemic racial equity transformation in K-12 school districts around the US. In that time, much of our work was building community partnerships with police departments, to help the system deepen its work around racial equity, implicit bias and community policing.

As a resident of Oakland since 2000, in both East and West Oakland, I've had multiple personal experiences with police officers. Often, I'd be in an official capacity as a school administrator, sometimes dealing with off site matters. Sometimes, I observe police activity on my streets or in the community, or have had to engage if they've been called to an incident on my block as a witness. Sometimes, police officers have been supportive and mindful. Sometimes, they have been explicitly problematic and demonstrated clear bias or lack of community policing principles. I hope these oversight committee meetings can help create a community support system as well as an accountability system. I've never been one to focus only on punitive, but prefer a system of deep support and development.

The work involves detailed analysis of the costs and potential benefits associated with various government programs, substantial engagement of relevant stakeholders within and external to government, and writing reports that guide can guide local capacity building or contract negotiations as local conditions dictate. This work has given me demonstrable experience in management, organizational planning, and report delivery.

Each of the engagements I have worked on have required substantial project management to keep a diverse team focused on meeting our objectives on time. An example is the development and analysis of a custom data set of individuals interacting a county's court, jail, or publicly funded behavioral health system. My client was interested in diverting a population of offenders with substance use disorders out of County jail and into outpatient treatment through a sentencing alternative. In order to understand what subset of this population we could serve we convened stakeholders from the Courts, jail, public defenders, victim's advocates, and service providers. Once we identified two populations that everyone could agree had unmet needs and would be willing to serve, we had to carefully design the creation of a dataset to measure how many individuals meeting proposed eligibility criteria were available and compare that to the budgeted capacity for the program. I led discussions with the data owners in the relevant departments around the specific needs for our analysis as well as data security protocols.

I assisted our own organization with strategic planning around integrating a partner with software solutions into our service offerings. I led conversations with our leadership to understand the initial visions for what such a partnership would look like. I researched potential partners fitting those visions and used initial criteria to bucket and assess the potential for fit. As it so happened, a previous partner of ours stepped away from an engagement and the results of my work were able to be used to quickly identify a replacement partner based on their complimentary skillsets and similar theory of change.

Report delivery is a crucial component of my job as a consultant. My team developed a clear outline for the report that reflected the discussions we had held with clear stakeholders. Once the client signed off on the outline we fleshed out key sections with their revisions. I led the drafting of the cost-benefit section which also involved updating an economic model that demonstrated likely scenarios based on participation in the proposed intervention. My section combined detailed prose that explained the tradeoffs of the available options along with graphs and charts to quickly demonstrate the relationship between key inputs and the project's viability.

Collectively, the skills outlined above would enable me to contribute to the proper functioning of the Police Commission and oversight of OPD.

Shortly after graduating high school, I participated in the Atlanta Bar Association's Summer Law Internship Program (SLIP). SLIP offers summer opportunities to Atlanta area high school students who are interested in learning more about the legal profession and is designed to achieve three goals: (1) to provide valuable work experience; (2) to further students' understanding of the law; and (3) to promote mentor relationships with the Atlanta legal community.

I spent eight weeks working with Assistant District Attorney Darius Pattillo of the Dekalb County District Attorney's Office. Most of my duties were administrative in nature, but I got to see the inner workings of a large prosecutor's office. I attended a full murder trial from beginning to end, sat in on conversations about legal strategy, and spoke with different prosecutors about their areas of focus and career goals. I learned how prosecutors work with investigators to build their cases, victim's advocates to develop sentencing recommendations, and with each other to take complex cases to trial.

I've maintained a relationship with my mentor and continued to go back to speak to subsequent classes of interns about my experiences in college and how to make the most of their time working alongside legal professionals.

In 2003 and 2004 had various conversations with then Chief Richard Word and the MPNC regarding the specific barriers in OPD culture that prevent effective communication with the community.

Worked with various Problem Solving/Community Resource Officers (PSO/CRO) since 1998 as the Chair of the Maxwell Park Neighborhood Council, Beat 28X. These contacts have met with various degrees of success over the years depending on the degree of commitment to Community Policing of the PSO/CRO. It is notable that this commitment to Community Policing is stronger at the Command Staff level that it is among mid level and line staff, including CRO's and Patrol, that have on occasion exhibited outright resistance to such partnership with the community.

Oakland was profoundly impacted by the deaths of the Fallen Four on March 21, 2009. On several occasions expressed my great disappointment to OPD regarding their not involving the community in their subsequent commemorations of these brave Officers, even after witnessing the outpouring of grief from a broad spectrum of Oaklanders immediately after their murders.

Collaborated with an OPD Captain to hold a youth workshop at a Community Policing Summit in 2011 at which the Captain provided ten Officers, all the materials and extremely valuable insights on the topics covered.

In 2011, upon the return to duty by our CRO Amie Rutten after an on-the-job injury, OPD arranged for the MPNC to deliver Get Well Cards and Chocolates to her as a surprise at an early morning lineup at Eastmont.

In late 2011 during Occupy, OPD allowed myself and three others to observe the arrests in the second clearing of Frank Ogawa Plaza. OPD also coordinated with the Peacekeepers in the marches and protests during that time. Various individuals in OPD have also expressed public and private support for the Peacekeeper concept.

Invited in 2012 by then Chief Howard Jordan to be on an Advisory Panel to his office. Represented the community in the interview process for promotions to Captain in OPD during that year.

1. Please describe any life work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare you to contribute to the work of the Commission.

Through a number of positions in the federal government, I have experience making balanced judgments about the propriety of law enforcement conduct; reviewing and making recommendations to improve law enforcement organizations; and leading initiatives to make law enforcement organizations more successful by becoming more open and transparent. In none of these positions have I actually worked in law enforcement. Rather, I have served with the perspective of a civilian who believes in their mission and believes they ought to be held to very high standards.

Reviews and recommendations. I recently served as the lead staffperson for an independent panel charged with reviewing the U.S. Secret Service's protection of the White House complex. Following some of the Secret Service's high-profile failures, our panel was charged with reviewing what had gone wrong and making recommendations to improve the Service's performance. The review was wide, and encompassed issues ranging from human resources, training, and staffing, to use-of-force policies and weaponry. We looked at the Service's budget and made recommendations for its next Director. We necessarily approached the issues with a sense of balance, where the mission is critical but the failures were obvious, and with an awareness of the need for a credible report that would earn public trust.

Oversight. In much of my work now, in private practice, I serve on teams that are appointed to "monitor" entities that have histories of wrongdoing and have been ordered onto paths for reform. While the Police Commission's work is different from the work of a "monitor," that work has informed how I approach oversight of an institution like the Police Department; it has taught me how to gather facts from organizations that can be resistant, the appropriate contours of reform, and how to tell the difference between change that an organization *can't* do and change that the organization *doesn't want* to do.

Openness and transparency. The Department of Justice has never been known as the most transparent of institutions, but like all agencies in this Administration, it was charged with finding ways to better fulfill its mission by becoming more open and transparent. I was asked to coordinate the Department's planning and implementation. We were ultimately ranked by open government groups as belonging in the top tier of federal agencies — and we did it not by reflexively adopting open-government "experts" recommendations, but by looking afresh at our mission and how new ideas could help us better achieve it.

Judgment. During my time as an Obama Administration appointee at the U.S. Department of Justice, as a Deputy Assistant Attorney General, one of my responsibilities was to determine when the Justice Department could no longer stand behind a law enforcement official who was accused of wrongdoing. That work required an understanding of the line between appropriate and inappropriate law enforcement conduct.

Through all of these experiences, I have gained some insight into the ways in which our law enforcement forces must balance their important competing obligations, and the costs of making reflexive judgments in one direction or another. I have also learned, through these and other experiences, that any group – and especially a Commission like this one – can be effective only when its members work hard to understand each other, draw out each other's priorities, and look for the understanding and common ground that can bring them together. I have been a consensus builder. Working together and listening to each other, we will undoubtedly be able to reach better decisions, improve policing, and build trust and credibility between the force and the community it protects.

My experience with the Oakland Police Department is from afar. But I have two mixed-race children, and I do not know today whether they will grow up to be victims of crime, suspected of crime, or police officers. My hope is that the work of this Commission and the City's and Department's other efforts will help build a police force that will be better prepared to protect them, will earn its community's trust, and will treat them with respect.

Born and raised in Los Angeles, I have been a resident of the Bay Area for 9 years. As a writer and researcher, I have worked with public officials, organizations, and community members to document and develop strategies for improving access to systems of justice and improving the life chances of people who are frequently underserved by local city governments, such as people of color, LGBTQ people, people with disabilities, immigrants, and low-income communities. I have actively tracked news on Oakland politics including OPD and the Alameda County Sheriff for the past 4 years as a community member interested in improving the democratic functions of our local government and the flourishing of our city.

From 2015-2016 I served on the Kaiser Permanente Research Bank's Community Advisory Board, where I provided input on the design and launch of a new biomedical research database, patient communications, and guidelines for researchers. I enjoyed contributing to a challenging and rewarding group dialogue, raising difficult questions and engaging constructively with Kaiser staff and other members of the board as we worked to ensure the needs of differently situated vulnerable communities would be met by Kaiser's new project.

From 2014-2015, I worked for two different legal publications as a senior staff editor performing substantive edits with people who had a wide variety of political orientations and professional values. While I sometimes disagreed with some of the arguments and conclusions of colleagues and other authors, we were all able to put our differences aside and work together amicably to ensure that the writing we published was rigorously fact-checked, thoroughly researched, legally sound, and of a high quality that would contribute meaningfully to crucial ongoing debates in our society.

I completed my J.D. in 2015, but I have not attempted any State Bar examinations and therefore am not a licensed attorney. I currently work at an Irish pub in Jack London Square where I regularly come into contact with a range of long-time Oakland residents, including first responders and members of law enforcement.

I have had no personal contact with the Oakland Police Department. My experiences with OPD has have been shaped in part by seeing members of the force interacting with friends and neighbors in West Oakland (2015-16) and East Oakland (2016-present). In 2015, for instance, my partner at the time (a queer-identified person of color) was parking outside of our home in West Oakland when three OPD vehicles quickly moved to

surround her car, after which multiple officers exited their vehicles to issue her a traffic citation. I was confused by the intensity of OPD's response for an expired tag. I have witnessed police officers harass Black neighbors apparently without cause as they walk down the same street they have lived on for decades, and some have shared with me that these sort of interactions are far from unusual. I have seen police officers assist neighbor families in successfully de-escalating domestic disputes when called on for help. And I have seen officers on their beat interact in jovial and familiar ways with local residents.

My experience of OPD is additionally informed by my work in various editorial and professional environments where I regularly track news developments related to Bay Area culture and the U.S. criminal justice system, including local law enforcement agencies. I can appreciate the conflicts of interest inherent to internal review processes within agencies and corporations, and am an advocate for independent investigations that give the public and local community members a voice in ensuring officials act in accordance with the law and the constitutional rights of the people they serve.

My experiences with the Oakland Police Department (OPD) have been very mixed. I have also co-facilitated a program called Code 33 where youth and police officers participate in a facilitated 5 week healing circle. Outside of work, most of my experiences with OPD have not been nearly as positive; these interactions are a mixture of apathetic responses to incidents in the community, laughter/disconnect at murder scenes, and harassment of community members (myself included). I would say I have had strong experiences that reveal the good and the bad within the Oakland Police Department.

1. Please describe any life work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare you to contribute to the work of the Commission.

I gained admission to the California State Bar on June 7, 1999 and have remained a member in good standing without incident since that time.

In 1997, as a Certified Law Student, I worked for the City Attorney for the City Dallas, Oregon. My primary duty was to prosecute misdemeanors for the City and advise Police Officers as needed. I spent 18 months working in that position and earned the respect and admiration of the police officers I that worked with me, despite a rocky start. My first day on the job, I went to file paperwork at the Oregon Supreme Court, in Salem, Oregon. On my way back, I passed a sheriff's transport van. I thought nothing of it, until I reached the Dallas City limits and saw a Police Officer coming my way. My heart sank because I knew he was coming for me. The transport van behind me slowed on the two lane road, allowing the police officer an opportunity to make a U-turn and get directly behind me. Once behind me, he turned on the lights and sirens for a traffic stop.

During the stop, it became clear that although he did not have probable cause, he was going to investigate vigorously. The traffic stop lasted 45 minutes. The extra time I had been given for my lunch to go to the Supreme Court was up. I was scheduled to be introduced to the Dallas Police Department after lunch. I was going to be late. Still early in my career, I was not sure what to do and I was scared to tell him who I was. He investigated my California Driver's license, my USAA insurance card and questioned me extensively. Ultimately, I cracked under the pressure which he saw as an admission of guilt. When I explained that I was worried my new boss would be upset that I failed to return from lunch on time, he asked where I worked. When I gave my boss's name, he reacted visibly. He then skeptically asked; Are you the new attorney assigned to the Police Department? I told him I was. He reintroduced himself and promptly pleaded that I stop crying. He also indicated that he looked forward to working with me and instructed that I need not tell my new boss about this encounter. I did tell my boss, not that day, but in the weeks to come. After I told him, his meeting with the Chief of Police resulted in that Sergeant being assigned to me for protection and as my liaison for all department related matters. He worked diligently to change my opinion of him and was successful. I only hope the time we worked together changed him, for the better.

My education and experience as a prosecutor and public defender has given me a unique experience with law enforcement; I have litigated with them, and against them. As such, I understand the dynamic of providing public safety while preserving your personal safety.

In 2013, I became a volunteer attorney with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. As a volunteer attorney, my focus has been on personnel issues, largely employee discipline in a union environment. Specifically, I review proposed discipline to determine whether it is based on an investigation and documentation that complies with the terms of the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) and federal rules and regulations.

My knowledge, skills, abilities and experiences provide with me a unique background that has prepared me to contribute to the work of the commission.

2. Please describe your contacts or experiences with the Oakland Police Department.

My direct contact with the Oakland Police Department as a resident has been largely positive. In mid-2010, the police announced that based on staffing shortages they would no longer respond to residential alarms. At the time, my neighborhood was being plagued by a group committing residential burglaries. On five separate occasions, my house was illegally entered. Each time, an ADT Security representative contacted me to confirm that it was not a false alarm. Each time when I confirmed that it wasn't, the Oakland Police Department responded and met me at my home. The last day, they came responded twice. In the morning the police arrived in record time, but found nothing out of the ordinary. Several hours later, they responded. The alarm was reported at 4:30 pm on a Friday afternoon. They responded promptly, but not as quickly as earlier. The arrested two teenagers exiting my property and held them until I arrived to confirm that in fact that did not have my permission to enter the property.

It's difficult to express the stress that plagued me in the summer of 2010. It was a difficult time. I am thankful that the Oakland Police continued to respond despite proclamations to the contrary.

Additionally, I have also had contact with members of the Oakland Police Department at various community events in the City of Oakland, for example at the Oakland Greek Festival.

As indicated previously, I have been both a prosecutor and a public defender. Additionally, in my capacity a prosecutor I was a City Attorney and part of my responsibilities included advising the Police Department.

I have also volunteered with Walk Oakland Bike Oakland, a local nonprofit, for several events. As part of those events, I am usually assigned to the traffic management and safety committee which has police interaction, including the Oakland and Emeryville Police Departments.

I am applying to sit on the Oakland Police Commission because as a parent and Oakland resident for 29 years, I care deeply about my town and want to be a part of its continuing positive transformation. My volunteer activities and career as a lawyer, law professor, special master, arbitrator and mediator demonstrate I have the demeanor, skills and experience as a committed, get-the-job-done leader and collaborative team member. My background, both working with law enforcement, as well as holding it accountable, make me uniquely qualified to be part of this historic moment in which a new Commission can create and implement balanced policies and oversee fair disciplinary procedures. Having more responsible and effective law enforcement that is responsive to all factions of our great and diverse community will benefit us all.

I practiced commercial and white-collar criminal law for 13 years with the Keker law firm before transitioning to being a neutral mediator. My 25-year mediation career has primarily involved employment and discrimination disputes, but encompasses all types of employment, business, and civil rights cases, some of which involved allegations of police misconduct and discriminatory practices; one matter involved the City of Oakland. I have successfully used the skills of listening to parties and lawyers, identifying their underlying interests and concerns, reframing issues, building trust in the mediation process and among the participants and helping disputants find ways to resolve differences by finding creative solutions. Because I believe Oakland's future depends on the success of our youth, I am a mentor and volunteer with the East Bay College Fund/Oakland Promise, supporting underserved Oakland youth in their college paths.

1. Please describe any life work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare you to contribute to the work of the Commission.

I received my bachelors' degree in Criminal Justice Administration from San Francisco State University and worked as an Administration Assistant to the Police Chief of the University Police Department. During my tenure at San Francisco State University, I took courses that allowed me to understand the treatment of distinguishing features of the U.S. criminal justice system and comparative perspectives of systems around the globe. And perspectives on the attention that is given to recurring problems including abuse of authority, community conflict, and discrimination in case processing. I had the opportunities to learn methods and applications for studying criminal justice systems and processes. All of these courses prepared me for the proper training to be engaged in my community regarding the issues of law, crime, and justice as well as the checks and balances of the government and the understanding of the rule of law.

As a former assistant to the Police Chief, my duties were to provide information requiring the interpretation of policies and procedures to the command staff and police chief. I produced a wide variety of drafts and finished documents to be added to the police department's general order, including confidential materials from taped dictation, brief instructions, and written materials from police commanders.

Following my departure from the police department, I was appointed by the California Superior Court Judge and confirmed by the Presiding Judge of the County of Alameda, Superior Courts of the State of California to the Juvenile Justice Commission. Furthermore, I worked with my colleagues on the board to help draft police policies to amend and add to the general orders. As Chairman, I made certain that board was operating within the legal purview of the board to ensure that police officers are held accountable for official misconduct of any sworn members of the Oakland Police Department.

In addition to the chartered duties, I have worked with the City of Oakland to make sure that the city has a professional and competent police department whose members behave with integrity and justice by reviewing the general orders of the Oakland Police Department. I lead rigorous scrutiny on the improved relationship and understanding between community members and

police officers including the coordination of said meetings with the community to hold regular public forums on various concerns regarding policy matters and individual cases alleging police misconduct.

 Please describe any life work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare you to contribute to the work of the Commission.

I spent my professional career fairly evenly divided between being a prosecutor, a criminal defense attorney (see 3.b. below) and a public safety policy analyst. As the Director of the Mayor's Office of Drugs and Crimes I pursued an extensive and intensive review of OPD policies and procedures. I reviewed monthly crime statistics and held weekly meetings with Captain in charge of the Criminal Investigation Division. I attended more than a dozen Department of Justice seminars and conferences on "Community Policing" and "Problem Oriented Policing". At he end of 2001 I wrote the Mayor's Public Safety Plan, the centerpiece of which was the evolution of the OPD deployment model from the "Beat 35" (911 response driven) to "Community Policing" (expanded citizen engagement with resource allocation based on data analysis). The City Council adopted the Mayor's plan in 1992 and created a "Community Policing Task Force" to develop specific recommendations for the implementation of the plan. I was assigned to staff the task force under the leadership of Councilmember Wilson Riles, Chair of the Public Safety Committee. I provided Chairman Riles with a proposed syllabus of readings and a list of suggested expert speakers, all of which were accepted. I collected and distributed the written materials and arranged the appearances of the speakers. I wrote the Task Force's final report and presented it to the City Council. The Council adopted same. I monitored the OPD implementation of the Council directive. I routinely attended community meetings to address citizen concerns regarding public safety matters. I served as the Mayor's primary point of contact and official spokesperson for all press matters related to public safety.

I recommended the creation of the Citizens Police Academy and expansion of the Asian Advisory Committee on Crime to further create an African-American Advisory Committee on Crime and a Latino Advisory Committee on Crime. I re-instated and staffed the Mayor's Inter-Agency Council on Drugs and Crime created by Mayor Lionel Wilson.

I acted as the Mayor's budget analyst for the OPD and the Citizens' Police Review Board (CPRB).

In 1997 the City Council sought to expand the jurisdiction and authority of the CPRB and formed a citizen task force to make recommendations accordingly. I staffed the task force and scribed the final report. I presented the report and the Council adopted it. I was selected to be the new director. I wrote the administrative manual for the CPRB, added additional staffing and conducted internal training on complaint intake, investigation and presentation to the Board. I served as principal negotiator, on behalf of the City Manager, with the Oakland Police Officers Association for all MOU matters concerning the CPRB. In preparation I thoroughly familiarized myself with the Police Officers Bill of Rights (Gov. Code Sec 3300 et seq). I established regular staff meetings with CPRB and the Internal Affairs Unit,

which lead to greater exchange of relevant information and formal approval by the Chief of Police for the mutual exchange of citizen complaints.

I have been arrested four times by the Oakland Police Department. Three cases were never charged. The one case that was charged was subsequently dismissed.

As a Deputy DA, Director of the Mayor's Office of Drugs and Crime and Director of the CPRB I have gone on more than 50 full shift ride-a-longs with OPD. I taught the class on Officer Rights before the CPRB as part of the OPD Academy curriculum.

As a prosecutor and defense attorney I had routine contact with OPD officers as witnesses or experts. As a prosecutor I often assisted officers with preparation of search warrants and line-ups. As a defense attorney I routinely accompanied clients to file complaints with Internal Affairs.

I began my professional career as a Deputy District Attorney assigned to the Oakland Municipal Court. I left the office to start a solo practice focusing on criminal defense. I left that practice to be commissioned as a USAF JAG Officer. I was assigned to two different Strategic Air Command bases, Andersen AFB (Guam) and March AFB (Riverside, CA). At both bases I was initially designated the Chief of Military Justice (base prosecutor). At both bases I successfully requested reassignment as the Area Defense Counsel (base public defender). After leaving the USAF I worked as an USDOJ/INS Trial Attorney prosecuting deportation cases before the San Francisco Immigration Courts. My caseload was primarily deportation cases predicated on criminal convictions.

As an associate in the Law Offices of John Burris my primary duties were intake case evaluation and criminal trials. Many cases involved claims of police misconduct. We also represented Oakland police officers. I acted as co-counsel in a case where two police officers were charged with perjury for statements given during a deposition for a separate civil rights case the officers had filed against the Oakland Police Department. I drafted a claim for an undercover Oakland police officer who was mistakenly beaten by other Oakland police officers during a drug bust that he was part of. I served as second chair in the defense of an Oakland jailer tried for conspiracy to aid in the escape of a federal prisoner. I also served as an associate in

the Law Offices of A. Brent Carruth. The sole area of practice was criminal defense. I handled cases from preliminary examination through jury trial.

After retiring from the PERS system I accepted an Assistant Attorney General position in Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), a part of the United States by covenant. My charge there was to establish and then supervise a Government Corruption/White Collar Crime Unit. I developed internal administrative procedures and also obtained outside funding for two attorney and two investigator positions. I left the CNMI, after several successful prosecutions, to accept the position of Director, Public Defender Service Corporation for the Territory of Guam. As the "Chief Public Defender" I managed a team of attorneys, investigators and support staff to provide legal representation for indigent defendants in criminal cases.

Both of my children began their professional careers as prosecutors. My daughter served as a Deputy District Attorney in Solano County for ten years. My son served as a Deputy District Attorney in Contra Costa County for three years. Both are now in private practice focusing on criminal defense.

Susan Raffanti Commissioner Application Supplemental Questions June 25, 2017

Question 1

My 28 years of work as a criminal defense lawyer and my one and a half years as a police review commissioner are the experiences which best prepare me to serve on the new police oversight commission.

I began working as a criminal defense attorney in Oakland a year after graduating from law school. My trial court practice was almost entirely in federal court, and I also handled indigent criminal appeals in state court. Federal cases move so slowly that a lawyer gets to know her clients and their families pretty well over the course of representation, and sometimes beyond. The majority of my clients were young men of color and I learned a lot about how they and their families viewed law enforcement officials and the treatment they received from them. The officers most involved in these cases were federal: FBI, DEA, ATF, and they often work in conjunction with local police and sheriffs' departments. In many cases, the perceptions of law enforcement were based on the defendants and their families and their communities feeling personally disrespected by officers, rather than the prosecution for the offense. As a white person in the 1980's, these narratives were new to me, but they were frequent and consistent and very quickly educated my view of police/community relations.

This work and other experiences, combined with my high identification with Oakland (born here and lived here most of my life), led to my desire to serve on the Oakland Citizen's Police Review Board in 2002 and 2003. I was appointed by Jerry Brown to finish out the term of a commissioner who left the board. I ended up not applying for another term because I found the board to be toothless and ineffective, burdened by 1) the pro-police bias of most of the commissioners in terms of fairly evaluating witness testimony, 2) the unwillingness or inability of most commissioners to thoroughly review the complaint files prior to hearing, and 3) the inability of the board as a whole to be anything other than a body micro-managed by the city staff person who served as the director. I think these are three major pitfalls in work of this kind and my application to the new board stems from a desire to see them corrected. Whether I serve on the commission or not, as an Oaklander I hope to see the new board use the tremendous power given to it by Measure LL to provide smart and effective police oversight in my city.

Question 2

My contacts with the OPD have been mostly through my previous work on police oversight as described above, through trial representation where an OPD officer might testify, through dealings with officers at the city jail when federal detainees were being housed there, with responding officers when I was the victim of a street robbery and when my house was burglarized, and during an incident in downtown Oakland that I ended up making a complaint about to the police oversight board.

All my dealings with officers as witnesses and at city jail have been respectful and professional, as have my experiences as a crime victim. When my husband and I were mugged in our neighborhood, the responding officers were very professional and empathetic, however one officer exerted pressure on us to identify someone from a street showup of several young black men even after we assured her that we would recognize the perpetrators and these were not them.

The incident I reported to an oversight board took place during a movie shoot downtown many years ago when a private security guard asked an OPD officer to disperse some young black men who were leaning up against a car watching the shoot. Without talking to the man, the officer grabbed him and twisted his arm behind his back and bounced him across the street and into his patrol car. The crowd was upset, as was I, and I made a complaint to whatever the board was called back then. The way the complaint was handled and the attitude that the police spokesperson had toward me was not confidence-inspiring. In the end, the complaint was upheld.

Question 3

As a defense attorney, I did some volunteer research and writing for Families Against Mandatory Minimums (FAMM). I volunteered in the Lawyers in the Library program for a few years. Most of my volunteer work has been mentoring and tutoring at risk youth in homeless shelters, community centers, and currently at Oakland High School.

1. Please describe any life, work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare you to contribute to the work of the Commission.

I believe I would bring a unique perspective and skillset to the Commission. As a practicing attorney and former journalist, I have developed an expertise in factual research, witness interviews (both friendly and hostile) and assessing competing narratives. I also have recent experience investigating alleged police misconduct (Oakland Citizens Police Review Board), prior work assisting in the prosecution of crimes, and a background in public policy analysis (Goldman School of Public Policy).

- As a practicing attorney (2005-present) my focus has been fact-intensive litigation involving individual and corporate disputes, usually including competing testimony and heavy documentation. I have also conducted internal investigations into public and private entities. Although it is not a focus of my practice, I have represented some criminal defendants, including one individual accused of a violent crime.
- As a law clerk for a federal district judge (2004-2005) I assisted in the adjudication of criminal and civil cases, including jury and bench trials.
- At the CPRB (2014-2015) my colleagues and I investigated citizen complaints about OPD conduct. There were some situations where citizen complaints were unfounded, and some situations where there was sufficient evidence of misconduct and the CPRB did everything within its power to hold OPD officers accountable. The CPRB also sought to make policy changes within OPD, subject (again) to the substantial limitations on CPRB's powers.
- At the Goldman School of Public Policy (UC Berkeley, Class of 2004), I was part of a student team that examined OPD's anti-slum housing program and released a report with our analysis and recommendations for improving operations. As part of that analysis, I accompanied OPD officers on several trips to different areas of the city where residents were suffering from substandard, and sometimes dangerous, housing conditions. I have also applied my policy analysis skills to other public entities, including the San Francisco Superior Court system and the Housing Authority for the County of Alameda.
- At Boalt Hall (UC Berkeley, Class of 2004) I studied various aspects of criminal law and procedure, and for one class I wrote a report examining how implicit bias could affect juror views of the credibility of allegations of law enforcement misconduct. The context of that report included the Oakland "Riders" situation and similar alleged misconduct in the Los Angeles Police Department, along with academic literature on racial bias in the legal system. I spent the bulk of my summers during law school working with prosecuting agencies: my first summer I worked with a special department of the San Francisco District Attorney's office that focuses on white collar prosecutions; my second summer I worked with the California Attorney General's antitrust division.

 As a journalist in Southern California (staff writer for the Los Angeles Daily News and Pasadena Star News, and freelance writer for the Ventura County Star and Los Angeles Times Ventura County Edition), I sometimes covered stories relating to crimes and crime victims. I also wrote investigative pieces on the operation of public agencies and private groups' attempt to influence agency decisions.

My approach to the work of the Commission would be as follows: thoroughly research the facts, give all sides an opportunity to state their best case, consider my own potential biases and ensure they were not interfering with a just outcome, render a fair decision on the merits, and consider whether any broader policy questions were implicated.

During my work analyzing OPD's anti-slum housing program, my colleagues and I worked closely with several OPD officers to understand then-current OPD policies for focusing on locations (both business and residential) that were associated with heightened criminal activity.

During my time on the CPRB my colleagues and I questioned OPD officers during investigative hearings into citizen complaints. I also organized and led the questioning of over a dozen officers in a multi-day (and multi-night) hearing in 2015 relating to damage to two Oakland residences during a failed attempt to locate and apprehend a suspect. My colleagues and I also questioned OPD leadership concerning OPD policies on the release of body camera footage.

A former junior OPD officer who is a friend of my extended family has had Thanksgiving dinner at my house in the past.

1. Please describe any life work and significant community volunteer experiences that prepare you to contribute to the work of the Commission.

In my work as an applied linguistic anthropologist, I research and teach about diversity and the subtle (and not so subtle) ways that bias is expressed in everyday life. When I left the university system six years ago to start my own company, it was because I was frustrated at all the knowledge and expertise that was stuck inside academia and not making it out to people who could really use it. I decided that this would be my life's work, to gather knowledge and then bring it to the places where it could be the most helpful. This is why I would like to volunteer for the position of Commissioner for the Oakland Police.

I collect data and stories about culture clashes, unconscious bias, and inappropriate sexualization of women in the workplace. These include stories about inappropriate police behavior, some of which happens in Oakland (as we all know). I work to understand the cultural and psychological forces that result in behavior that isn't optimal. I also keep up to date on academic studies that are relevant to police interactions with the public and police departments as workplaces. For example, colleagues of mine down at Stanford just published a study showing that police officers are consistently less respectful when speaking to Black motorists during traffic stops. And Georgetown just put out a study showing that black girls are seen as more adult and less innocent than their white peers, even when they are as young as five.

Ever since I started writing about <u>unconscious demotions</u> and other kinds of bias, people have been telling me, "Boy, you should start training the police! They really need you." But, honestly, I think other kinds of training and interventions are far more important to the police, and I feel like working on the police commission would be the best way for me to use my skill set and knowledge to really help and make a difference. My background and knowledge would be a good complement for a commission where other people have expertise based on their own life experiences and their own (and their families' and friends') encounters with the police.

My regular volunteer work is always environmental. I am a docent with the East Bay Regional Parks, based in Crab Cove in Alameda. And I regularly volunteer to help clean up and restore the bay – beach cleanups, native habitat restoration, citizen science bioblitzes, and more. While this is pretty far removed from the police, it does show that I'm a person who volunteers and can be relied upon to show up when I've committed to do volunteer work.

I love Oakland. I have lived all across the country, and once I stopped teaching at UCLA and was free to move wherever I wanted, this is the city I chose to move back to. I would love to live in a city with a police department that isn't plagued by sexual misconduct and cover-ups, extrajudicial killings, and noticeably different treatment of citizens depending on their race. I would love to instead have a department that has good relations with the community, where people (who aren't just white) trust and talk with their community police, where there is greater transparency and

accountability, and where the important work of violence prevention, enforcement of laws, and maintenance of safe spaces can be the real focus. As a member of the Commission, I would love to work with the police to help realize that vision.

2. Please describe your contacts or experiences with the Oakland Police Department.

Since 1995, when I first moved to the Bay Area, I have had very few personal contacts or experiences with the Oakland Police Department, and they have all been professional and pleasant. In the late 1990s, I reported a break-in at a friends' house when they were out of town. Around two years ago, I had to have a police officer approve a repair for a fix-it ticket. And that's about it.

I am a middle-class, sort of white (technically white, but look Latina) woman. I would like to live in an Oakland where people who aren't short white middle-class women consistently have the same kinds of pleasant, respectful, cordial, unremarkable interactions with their local police.



Supplemental Questionnaire Answers

Answer to question #1

My life work has always been about seeking truth and justice. I was only the second black police officer to be hired in the history of El Segundo PD (El Segundo, CA) in 1988. At the time of my hire El Segundo PD had a reputation for being a racist police department and a segregated and racist community. Although there were apparent signs of racism both in the department and in the community my personal experiences with my fellow officers was mostly one of mutual respect. I was a bit of a contrarian when it came down to sensitive issues around race, sexism, homophobia, culture, etc. My opinions around these issues were often different from my coworkers. The one thing we did at El Segundo PD (often instigated by me) was talk at length about these issues. I honestly believe that these conversations as well as my physical presence in the field (on service calls) made a difference in seeking truth and bringing about justice.

I volunteered in a 2nd grade LA unified classroom as a moving meditation instructor in 2002. Working with second graders in this capacity proved to be a humbling and educational experience.

After graduating from massage school in 2000 I volunteered in a nursing home in Los Angeles offering gentle massage to the residents. I initially did it to gain experience but eventually found it to be very rewarding and purposeful.

The level of gratitude I experienced from both the 2nd graders and the nursing home residents was palpable to say the least.

Answer to question #2

I have no personal contacts or experiences with the Oakland Police Department.

Answer to question #3

The City of El Segundo hired me as a Police Officer in 1988. I served 11 years before receiving a medical retirement in 1999 due to back-related issues for which I opted not to have surgery.
